Investigation at New Orleans, Louisiana disclosed that Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD, mother of LEE HARVEI OSWALD, was employed during 1943 or 1944 at Jean's Hosiery, 727 Canal Street, New Orleans. This employment was very short, and possibly only lasted about one week.

IRENE CRAMFORD, Supervisor, Jean's Hosiery, 727 Canal Strtet advised on December 10, 1963, that no employment records were maintained in New Orleans. She stated that old employment records could be checked at Shrevepart, La., by contacting Mr. FRANE KATZENSTIEN, owner of Jean's Hosiers.

On 12/6/63 while talking to the Bureau on another. natter, I was transferred to Mr. SIzOO of the Bureau. I inquired of Mr. SIZOO as to the status of the Secret Service interest in this case, including the assassination investigation and the RUBI investigation. SIZOO stated that the President of the United States instructed the FBI to conduct investigation into all aspects of the assassination of President EENNEDY.

I advised SIZOO I was in receipt of a request from the local Secret Service for the identity of the printing company where OSWALD had the FPCC handbills and FPCC applecation and membership cards printed. I asked if this should be made available to Secret Service on a local level.

8IZ00 maid this information should not be made available and that the Bureau had had several instances where Secret Service was interviewing people that Bureau Agents had previously interviewed or vas interviewing persons that Bureau representatives had not yet interviewed and as a practical matter, Secret Service had no authority to do so in view of the President' instructions, together with the fact the FBI has jurisdiction over all Internal Security matters.

8IZ00 stated that the Bureau' liaison representative ORIN BARILETT had been in contact with Secret Service on several occasions, including sometime on the morning of 12/6/63, in connection with reported inquiries Secret Service is making. $81 Z 00$ stated he would again have BARTLETT contact Secret Service in this regard and in the meantime, the above request should not be complied with.

It is noted that prior to the above call, JOMA RICE of Secret Service, New Orleans, had talked with Supp, ALKRR and had specifically requested the above-mentioned data. In View of the instructions I obtained from SIzOO, I called RICE

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$4: 25$ p.m., $12 / 6 / 63$, and informed hin that $I$ understood the FBI should handle all investigation in this matter and that in viev of this, it appeared that the request he received irom his headquarters should have been more properiy made of the FBI headquarters in Washington since the data would be available there. RICE then stated that the Secret Service interest was limited to determining certain facts that ight be of value in connection with Secret Service responsibility for the protection of President JOHNSON and explained further that if there was a conspiracy in the assassination of President KENNEDY, the conspiracy might extend to the assassination of KENNEDY's predecessor.

During this contact, RICE stated the Secret Service was under instructions to turn over to the FBI any information Secret Service may have developed that would seen pertinent to this overall matter.

ADDENDUY BY SAC MAYNOR, 12/10/63
At 5:19p.m., 12/6/63, Mr. SIZ00 of the Bureau called. Ee stated this matter had been taken up with Secret Service through the Bureau's Liaison Section and that Secret Service was issuing instructionsto Mr. RICE to discontinue investigation in regard to the above mentioned phase of this matter.

At approximately 5:25 p.E. I oelled Mr. RICE and informed hin I had received information he would receive instructions to discontinue his investigation to determine the source vhere the FPCC handbills and FPCC application and membership cards were printed. RICB indicated but did not specirically say that he had already received such instructions.

RICS desired to discuss at length the Secret Service responsibilities concerning safeguarding the President and desired to engage in speculation as to whether the assassination of President KENNEDY was a conspiracy.

RICE asked $1 f$ I could suggest what he should do and I auggested to him that he clarify this particular question with his M hendquarters in washington, D. C.

On 12/10/63, at 9:45 arm. I talked to Mr. JIM MiLLs at Dallas. I asked MALoRY whether Dallas planned to submit results of all Lab examinations or whether New Orleans and other offices were expected to submit results of Lab examinations of the material submitted by the respective offices.

Manley stated that Dallas is preparing a report and Will devote one section thereof to results of FBI Lab examinations and therefore, it will not be necessary for View Orleans to submit the same data in any Hew Orleans report.

For MaLhry'a information $I$ gave him a brief, oral resume of the leads and various lines of investigation Nev Orleans is current. pursuing in connection with the OSWALD case.

On 12/11/63 personally calleatat ta iew orleans ofilice ana stated that she has meant to coae in and contact an agent relative to the folloring information which she stated Eleht be pertinent, as it concerned the assassination of President JOHN F. CEMNEDY:

She stated br information that for the past several years she has topped at least one time a veek at Karinello's Beauty School, 528 Canal Street, and added that after having her hair fixed, she regularly stopped at a Greek Restaurant located in the 100 block of Canp street.

She stated that sonetime during August, 1963, she happened to observe on Canal street, an indisidual and two associates, all of whom appeared to be passing out handbills. she explained that one individual handed her a handbill, which she said she still believed vas in her home, although she has been unable to inad it after thoroughly eearching her residence. She stated she vould $\Rightarrow$ continue to search her residence and contact the Fev Orleans $\therefore$ Office if this handbill vere located.

Ehe etated that she only observed the activity of these persons for a fer moments and "did not pay any more attention to then." she stated that she was not avare that also soaetime in August, 1963, persons vere passing out handbills in front of the International Trade Part, located at 124 Camp 8treet. .

She stated that sometime after fovember 22,1963, she recalled that ons of the individuals she observed on Canal 8treet, passing out handbills, bore a resenblance to LEE HARYBY OSWALD, who she said was so widely displayed
$\therefore$ through television and newspaper coverage of the assassination of the president.

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She stated that she would not be in any
position to describe the person that she said resembled OSWALD, nor could she furnish any information describing his associates, whom she said she observed to be passing out handbills.
passing out inuuricin on August 16, 1963, at the International Trade Mart, 124 Camp Street, Few Orleans, La., Which photographs had been furnished for the use of the FBI by television station WDSD and she : picked out a photograph of OSWALD as being identical with the person she said she had observed on Canal Street and stated that this vas the same person who was identified through television coverage as OSWALD. She stated he could not identify any other individuals represented in these photographs, however, an individual pictured in these photographs, as possibly holding several handbills with a notation "X" above hin, in her opinion bore a coosiderable resemblance to an individual that she had seen on numerous occasions, who may have been employed in a restaurant known as "The Greek's", in the 100 block of Camp street. She stated that approximately six months ago, this restaurant vas closed and she believed the owner named, MAKUEI had died and the space occupied by this restaurant had been purchased by the waterbury prus store.

She stated that possibly someone in the 100 block of Camp Street, would be able to further identify persons depicted in these photographs and that the following persons might be contacted.

She mated that a newsboy named jomnry had operated news stand on the corner of Camp and Canal

MOORE stated Dallas stated there had been no much attempt made and he assumed QUIGLEY, when he interviewed hin, made no attempt, no request of any type or kind to develop OSWALD as an informant and he was so advising the Director.

I advised Mr. MOORE that this could be done, that I would check with Mr.quighey to be positive but our records show nothing to indicate we had ever attempted or requested OSWALD to be an informant.

I advised mOORE if he did not hear back from ne to the contrary, his answer should stand.
