Investigation at New Orleans, Louisiana disclosed that Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD, mother of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, was employed during 1943 or 1944 at Jean's Hosiery, 727 Canal Street, New Orleans. This employment was very short, and possibly only lasted about one week.

IRENE CRAMFORD, Supervisor, Jean's Hosiery, 727 Canal Street advised on December 10, 1963, that no employment records were maintained in New Orleans. She stated that old employment records could be checked at Shreveport, La., by contacting Mr. FRANK KATZENSTIEN, owner of Jean's Hosiery.

Attached are r/d copies of FD-302s of interviews with Colonel JOHN C. EVERS, Lt. Col. DAVID E. MYERS and M/Sgt. JAMES S. KING, School Operations, 3380th Technical School, Keesler AFB, Miss., containing information relative to the eight (8) point memo of reference of SA ALKER dated 12/6th.

In summary; as to:

- #1 Record mentioned in SL teletype of 12/5/63, is only available record re verification of attendance dates.
- #2 School was a service school, used mainly in 1957 by Air Force & Marines.
- #3 Instructor's identity not of record; some co-student of OSWALD may recall name, it has been suggested.
- #4 Course of instruction. See FD-302 of MYERS.
- #5 Roster of students attending with OSWALD will have to be extracted from 'orders' in OSWALDS retired 201 personnel file, where-ever it may be.
- #6 Every indication from interviewees, is that OSWALD would have lived 'on-base' but no way to determine which barracks.
- #7 No data available Keesler AFB as to which dormitory may have been utilized.
- #8 In light of interviews, this portion irrelevant.

On 12/6/63 while talking to the Bureau on another matter, I was transferred to Mr. SIZOO of the Bureau. I inquired of Mr. SIZOO as to the status of the Secret Service interest in this case, including the assassination investigation and the RUBY investigation. SIZOO stated that the President of the United States instructed the FBI to conduct investigation into all aspects of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

I advised SIZOO I was in receipt of a request from the local Secret Service for the identity of the printing company where OSWALD had the FPCC handbills and FPCC application and membership cards printed. I asked if this should be made available to Secret Service on a local level.

SIZOO said this information should not be made available and that the Bureau had had several instances where Secret Service was interviewing people that Bureau Agents had previously interviewed or was interviewing persons that Bureau representatives had not yet interviewed and as a practical matter, Secret Service had no authority to do so in view of the President's instructions, together with the fact the FBI has jurisdiction over all Internal Security matters.

SIZOO stated that the Bureau's liaison representative ORIN BARTLETT had been in contact with Secret Service on several occasions, including sometime on the morning of 12/6/63, in connection with reported inquiries Secret Service is making. SIZOO stated he would again have BARTLETT contact Secret Service in this regard and in the meantime, the above request should not be complied with.

It is noted that prior to the above call, JOHN RICE of Secret Service, New Orleans, had talked with Supv. ALKER and had specifically requested the above-mentioned data. In view of the instructions I obtained from SIZOO, I called RICE

at 4:25 p.m., 12/6/63, and informed him that I understood the FBI should handle all investigation in this matter and that in view of this, it appeared that the request he received from his headquarters should have been more properly made of the FBI headquarters in Washington since the data would be available there. RICE then stated that the Secret Service interest was limited to determining certain facts that might be of value in connection with Secret Service responsibility for the protection of President JOHNSON and explained further that if there was a conspiracy in the assassination of President KENNEDY, the conspiracy might extend to the assassination of KENNEDY's predecessor.

During this contact, RICE stated the Secret Service was under instructions to turn over to the FBI any information Secret Service may have developed that would seem pertinent to this overall matter.

ADDENDUM BY SAC MAYNOR, 12/10/63

At 5:19p.m., 12/6/63, Mr. SIZOO of the Bureau called. He stated this matter had been taken up with Secret Service through the Bureau's Liaison Section and that Secret Service was issuing instructions to Mr. RICE to discontinue investigation in regard to the above mentioned phase of this matter.

At approximately 5:25 p.m. I called Mr. RICE and informed him I had received information he would receive instructions to discontinue his investigation to determine the source where the FPCC handbills and FPCC application and membership cards were printed. RICE indicated but did not specifically say that he had already received such instructions.

RICE desired to discuss at length the Secret Service responsibilities concerning safeguarding the President and desired to engage in speculation as to whether the assassination of President KENNEDY was a conspiracy.

RICE asked if I could suggest what he should do and I suggested to him that he clarify this particular question with his headquarters in Washington, D. C.

On 12/10/63, at 9:45 a.m. I talked to Mr. JIM MALLEY at Dallas. I asked MALLEY whether Dallas planned to submit results of all Lab examinations or whether New Orleans and other offices were expected to submit results of Lab examinations of the material submitted by the respective offices.

MALLEY stated that Dallas is preparing a report and will devote one section thereof to results of FBI Lab examinations and therefore, it will not be necessary for New Orleans to submit the same data in any New Orleans report.

For MALLEY's information I gave him a brief, oral resume of the leads and various lines of investigation New Orleans is currently pursuing in connection with the OSWALD case.

- 2) In reference to the picture of the sling on the gun, as soon as one is available from the Bureau, it will be forwarded to the New Orleans Office.

According to GRAMBLING, this sling has buckles instead of hook fasteners which are ordinarily on gun slings. GRAMBLING stated that from some of the places they have contacted in Dallas, it is indicated there is a possibility this was a homemade sling and the Laboratory is being asked to carefully examine the sling to see if it is an improvised sling.

Mr. John Ray Edwards, 1570 Harcourt Drive, New Orleans, has advised that about five times during the past five years he has checked out of the Main Branch of the New Orleans Public Library a book entitled "Shooter's Bible" - Stoeger Arms Corp. There is a purchase application form inserted in this book between pages 264-265. The back of this purchaser's application form contains certain writing, which he recalls has been on that form since he first checked this book out. On back of the form, under part 1 is the following:

"Exemption from the provisions of the Federal Firearms Act is claimed by reason of the fact that the purchaser is:

a professional president assassin

and a pistol is essential to my business
(State buyer's official position or business which entitles exemption)
iness Signature

Under part 2 is the following:

Full Name: "John E. Doe"
Sex: "Neuter"
Residence: "0000 Nothing Drive"
"Noplace, O, A state U. S. A."

On 12/10/63, KEITH W. RUSH, Announcer, radio station WSMB, 13th Floor, 921 Canal Street, casually remarked, as he was being interviewed in connection with a case captioned "Radio Station WDSU, New Orleans, Louisiana, EDGAR STERN, JR., President, SSA, '48-Re-employment," that he had been told that sometime approximately August, 1963, that LEE HARVEY OSWALD called the radio station, WDSU. He stated it was his understanding that OSWALD had contacted a female receptionist at this station and had requested that he be allowed to make a tape for later broadcast by the radio station WDSU, in order that he might express his views better to the public at large.

LEAD:

Will contact female receptionist at radio station WDSU, 13th Floor, Maison Blanche Building, 921 Canal, and determine if OSWALD requested to make a tape for broadcast of this station sometime approximately August, 1963.

On 12/11/63, [redacted] personally called at the New Orleans Office and stated that she has meant to come in and contact an agent relative to the following information which she stated might be pertinent, as it concerned the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY:

She stated for information that for the past several years she has stopped at least one time a week at Marinello's Beauty School, 528 Canal Street, and added that after having her hair fixed, she regularly stopped at a Greek Restaurant located in the 100 block of Camp Street.

She stated that sometime during August, 1963, she happened to observe on Canal Street, an individual and two associates, all of whom appeared to be passing out handbills. She explained that one individual handed her a handbill, which she said she still believed was in her home, although she has been unable to find it after thoroughly searching her residence. She stated she would continue to search her residence and contact the New Orleans Office if this handbill were located.

She stated that she only observed the activity of these persons for a few moments and "did not pay any more attention to them." She stated that she was not aware that also sometime in August, 1963, persons were passing out handbills in front of the International Trade Mart, located at 124 Camp Street.

She stated that sometime after November 22, 1963, she recalled that one of the individuals she observed on Canal Street, passing out handbills, bore a resemblance to LEE HARVEY OSWALD, who she said was so widely displayed through television and newspaper coverage of the assassination of the president.

She stated that she would not be in any position to describe the person that she said resembled OSWALD, nor could she furnish any information describing his associates, whom she said she observed to be passing out handbills.

[REDACTED] was furnished photographs of persons passing out handbills on August 16, 1963, at the International Trade Mart, 124 Camp Street, New Orleans, La., which photographs had been furnished for the use of the FBI by television station WDSU and she picked out a photograph of OSWALD as being identical with the person she said she had observed on Canal Street and stated that this was the same person who was identified through television coverage as OSWALD. She stated she could not identify any other individuals represented in these photographs, however, an individual pictured in these photographs, as possibly holding several handbills with a notation "X" above him, in her opinion bore a considerable resemblance to an individual that she had seen on numerous occasions, who may have been employed in a restaurant known as "The Greek's", in the 100 block of Camp Street. She stated that approximately six months ago, this restaurant was closed and she believed the owner named, MANUEL had died and the space occupied by this restaurant had been purchased by the Waterbury Drug Store.

She stated that possibly someone in the 100 block of Camp Street, would be able to further identify persons depicted in these photographs and that the following persons might be contacted.

She stated that a newsboy named JOHNNY had operated a news stand on the corner of Camp and Canal Street in front of Fantasy Lounge for more than 20 years and another newsstand operated, was located directly across the street from him on Camp Street. Also she stated that persons might be contacted in the other stores and locations in the area between the International Trade Mart and Waterbury's Drug Store, on Camp Street.

At 4:00 p.m., 12/10/63, Inspector DON MOORE of the Bureau telephonically contacted this office and stated newspapers had made a statement we had tried to develop OSWALD as an informant.

MOORE stated Dallas stated there had been no such attempt made and he assumed QUIGLEY, when he interviewed him, made no attempt, no request of any type or kind to develop OSWALD as an informant and he was so advising the Director.

I advised Mr. MOORE that this could be done, that I would check with Mr. QUIGLEY to be positive but our records show nothing to indicate we had ever attempted or requested OSWALD to be an informant.

I advised MOORE if he did not hear back from me to the contrary, his answer should stand.
