Re New Orleans airtel to Bureau 12/26/63 and report of SA JOHN JAMES O'FLAHERTY dated 12/20/63 at New York.

On 1/9/64, Mr. EDWARD ROGGE, Associate Dean, College of Arts and Sciences, Tulane University, New Orleans, La. advised SA PAUL R. ALKER that telephone UN 6-2741 was until 12/19/63 the telephone number of Tulane University as well as Newcomb College, a division of Tulane University. He stated that extension 276 was a temporary number used during the Summer of 1963 for rooms 966, 974 and 976 of Monroe Hall, a dormitory on the campus of Tulane. He stated that the occupants of these rooms during Summer of 1963 could undoubtedly be obtained from the Tulane housing office.

AT NEW ORLEANS, LA. DR.

Will interview H. WARNER KLOEPFER, Professor in the Department of Anatomy, Tulane University, to determine if he resided in one of the above three rooms any time during the Summer of 1963 and whether he may have been contacted by OSWALD. It is noted that Mrs. RUTH PAINE did contact the wife of Professor KLOEPFER as a member of American Friends Service Committee and request that she contact MARINA OSWALD, which Mrs. KLOEPFER did.

At 10:20 am this date SA WARREN C. deBRUEYS advised by long distance telephone from Dallas, Texas that the following teletype was received by the Dallas Office, a copy of which was not furnished to New Orleans:

"11:34 PM 1-10-63 (should be 64)

"To: Director /105-82555/ &
SAC, DALLAS

"From: SAC, RICHMOND /105-3777/

"LEE HARVEY OSWALD. IS/ R.

"Re New Orleans tel to Director, Dallas and Norfolk today.

"DAVID VAUGHN HOFFMAN, Apt. sixteen, Colonial Court Apts., Colonial Heights, Va., advised today he resided four one zero seven Freret St., New Orleans, La. from approximately May to August, sixtythree with two roommates, JOHN HEGGARTY and TONY ECCLES. During that time about three parties held at that location attended by Tulane students and outsiders. HOFFMAN states he has never met or known of OSWALD and definitely never saw OSWALD at any party he ever attended.

"HOFFMAN, HEGGARTY and ECCLES members of "The Group" having reputation as "wierd" and "way out." HOFFMAN states HEGGARTY last known to be in Jamestown, N.Y. possibly connected with Anton Theatre. ECCLES presently sophomore at Tulane University, New Orleans.

"HEGGARTY slept for short time at apartment with one [REDACTED] former student, Newcomb College, New Orleans. [REDACTED] somewhere in Fla.

"Leads to locate and interview HEGGARTY, ECCLES and [REDACTED] being left to discretion of Dallas."

SA deBRUEYS advised that the indices in the Dallas Office in this matter fail to reflect any previous interviews with HEGGARTY, ECCLES or [REDACTED]. He also advised that there was no other information in the Dallas Office re HEGGARTY, ECCLES and [REDACTED]. SA deBRUEYS further advised that New Orleans should handle leads to locate ECCLES and [REDACTED] and should also attempt to establish a more definite address for HEGGARTY and based on information and investigation conducted regarding this particular matter, New Orleans should determine whether or not any or all of these three should be interviewed. He states they should be interviewed unless New Orleans has developed information that would make it unnecessary or inadvisable.

Dallas should be furnished with copies of any communications setting out interviews in this matter.

On 1/14/64, one HERBERT LYON, 1121 Casa Calvo, Algiers, La. telephoned the NO office and advised that a fellow who used to live with him, believed a marine, left some papers or clothing and he believed this individual had some connection with OSWALD. He did not wish to talk about matter on the phone and requested an agent come to his residence and look the stuff over. He further claimed he had been with intelligence during WW I and knew what he was talking about.

Individual appeared to be Cajun and talked with Cajun accent. It is suggested he be contacted even though it is doubtful there is any merit to his information.

On 1/15/64, I contacted MR. HERBERT LYONS at 1121 Casa Calvo, Algiers, La. regarding the information he referred to in his call to this office on 1/14/64 which is set out in the above referenced memo.

LYONS advised that a young man named HUTSON came to his house and rented a room about 8 days before 11/22/63. He did not know how HUTSON knew he had rooms to rent.

LYONS said HUTSON stayed about 4 days and did not work. After about 4 days HUTSON told LYONS he had received a letter and tickets for a greyhound bus from his sister in order that he might come home to be with his brother who had been in an auto accident. LYONS claimed not to know the name of HUTSON's home town. HUTSON then left the LYONS home taking one suitcase and leaving some old clothing. In order to make the trip, HUTSON had to borrow \$5 from LYONS.

After HUTSON had departed, 3 or 4 days before 11/22/64, LYONS could not be sure, three newspapers from Dallas, Texas arrived at the LYON'S home for HUTSON.

LYONS said this made him suspicious of HUTSON.

A survey of the room occupied by HUTSON resulted in the following;

There was a letter from the Dallas, Texas Chamber of Commerce addressed to GERALD C. HUTSON 1121 Casa Calvo, Algiers, La. welcoming him as a new comer to Dallas and setting forth the usual information such as a Chamber of Commerce would plus the fact they were sending information on employment.

The Dallas Newspapers were copies of the Dallas Morning News dated 11/20,21,22 and 23/63.

Also in this room was a name plate which read ' G.C. HUTSON USMC 11810932. There was an agreement for Services Card from the ABC Employment Service (apparently in New Orleans but did not so indicate) on which the following appeared;

There was also some old shirts and trousers in the room.

During the above interview, LYONS consumed about $\frac{1}{2}$ quart of wine. He is 70 years of age and somewhat infirmed. He talks in a rambling manner, skipping from one subject to another.

LYONS could furnish no specific reason why he thought HUTSON should be considered suspicious. HE said HUTSON never spoke of politics, J.F. KENNEDY or OSWALD but he "felt" this suspicion. He added that he had been with the intelligence during WW I.

There is absolutely no evidence to show that HUTSON was ever remotely connected with OSWALD or this case.

It is recommended that no further action be taken on this matter.

For the information of Los Angeles, VERKEN ALEXANDER advised Atlanta Office 11/25/63, that while a student at Sophie Newcomb College, she and ROBERT HOFFMAN, a Tulane University student, published a newspaper, "The Seed", which she described as a very liberal paper. She said that ROBERT HOFFMAN's brother DAVID HOFFMAN, held a party during the summer in his apartment and identified a number of individuals who attended this party. She had a strong belief that OSWALD may have possibly been present.

All of the individuals named by ALEXANDER as having attended this party, have been interviewed in an effort to determine whether OSWALD attended. It is noted that in Mrs. ALEXANDER's letter, she stated that she received a letter from one of her friends who indicated that he had been interviewed and mentioned that "a mutual friend in New Orleans had written him saying that he had known OSWALD".

The New Orleans Office has been attempting to learn the identities of all acquaintances of OSWALD in New Orleans and to interview these individuals.


