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

WARREN advised that VAUGHN merely drops in to see him on infrequent occasions and that VAUGHN is regularly employed in the kitchen of the TB Hospital at Greenwell Springs, La.



> CALLIHAN was interviewed and results have been dictated in form of FD-302. After interviewing CALLIHAN, I telephonically contacted SA MICHAEL BARON at Baton Rouge and furnished him with the results of this interview and furnished him with information as to possible whereabouts of JIMMY MCCURLEY in Baton Rouge.

SA BARON stated that he intends to contact BILL DANIELS, DA's Office, and will attempt to locate and interview JIMMY MCCURLEY. He said he would call in the results of his investigation to New Orleans later today.

It is noted that CALLIHAN stated that in addition to JIMMY MCCURLEY, his brother, RICHARD MCCURLEY, reportedly had some knowledge of OSWALD in New Orleans, but CALLIHAN had no information on this matter.


It is suggested that efforts be made to locate RICHARD MCCURLEY in New Orleans for interview.

At approximately 8:50 a.m., Mr. KEN HOWE, Dallas, furnished the following answers to questions contained in Bulet.

Dallas received first information that OSWALD #9 had left Dallas by New Orleans letter to Dallas, 7/17/63, received 7/19/63. A verifax copy of this letter was sent to the Bureau under cover of Dallas airtel to Bureau 12/8/63, attention Assistant Director GALE. Letter of 7/19/63 reflects information received by New Orleans from NYO by letter dated 7/5/63 to effect one LEE H. OSWALD had an address of P. O. Box 30061, New Orleans. New Orleans had a file on LEE HARVEY OSWALD showing Dallas as origin and thus sent the information to Dallas as probably applicable to this individual. By letter to New Orleans 7/29/63 that office was advised by Dallas that OSWALD's address unknown and 'confirmation of his presence in New Orleans was requested. This matter is covered also in Dallas airtel to Bureau of 12/8/64 previously mentioned.

SA HOSTY's report of 9/10/63 set forth information #11 as to OSWALD's residence and employment in New Orleans from New Orleans letter to Dallas dated 8/13/63. In preparing his report of 10/31/63, SA KAACK used the content of his same letter in setting forth residence and employment, thus accounting for identicalness of this information in both reports. New Orleans letter above was responsive to Dallas letter of 7/29/63, mentioned under #9 above, and contains understandably only the required information as to residence and employment so origin could be changed, which action New Orleans requested therein.

The miditional information reported by SA KAACK in report 10/31/63 was<sup>#</sup>sent to Dallas since it would subsequently be and was reported by New Orleans after that office became origin. Origin was changed from Dallas to New Orleans by Dallas PD-128 to Bureau and New Orleans, also submitted under date 9/10/63.

Since both LEE HARVEY and MARINA OSWALD were individual case subjects, Dallas letter to New Orleans 7/29/63 and New Orleans letter to Dallas 8/13/63 both mentioned above carried dual captions. The content of this letter was not and was not intended to be a direct quote of the information obtained from the source. The New Orleans letter refers in its content to the OSWALDS merely as "the subjects" in reporting the information on residence received from Mrs. GARNER. A subsequent difference in rephrasing this unquoted information by each Agent accounts for the variation. SA HOSTY changed "the subjects" to "LEE HARVEY OSWALD and his wife". SA KAACK changed it to "subject and his wife"; while SA deBRUEYS saw fit to change it to "his wife, MARINA NIKOLAEVNA OSWALD". Bach accurately reports the basic information and in substance says the same thing. It is perhaps pertinent to note reports of SA HOSTY and SA KAACK are each under single title of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

At approximately 2:45 p.m. Supv. KEN HOWE of Dallas furnished the following answers to questions 5 and 6 of President's Commission letter of 3/26/64 and also results of interview with former SA JOHN W. FAIN on 3/31/64.


#### Question #5

Administrative pages of report of retired SA JOHN W. FAIN dated 7/10/62 reflect OSWALD was curt and short in answers to some questions, cold, arrogant and generally uncooperative. SA FAIN main set out a lead for himself to reinterview OSWALD thus appearing to indicate his dissatisfaction with OSWALD's attitude during and the results of the interview, however, SA FAIN's report does not reflect he had reason to believe OSWALD a dangerous person. Dallas supervision after review of report concurred and approved it with lead for reinterview.

#### Question #6

There is no special reason apparent in Dallas file as to why OSWALD interviewed "so soon thereafter". The second interview of OSWALD was conducted on 8/16/62 and not 8/14/62 as set out in letter. Daily reports of SA FAIN do show he made attempts to contact OSWALD on 8/14 and 15 but he was not successful in doing this until 8/16/62 as shown in his daily report of that date and on FD-302 covering interview in his report of 8/30/62. Evaluation mf by FAIN as result of second interview, based on result of it in his report of 8/30/62, would appear to have some continued dissatisfaction with OSWALD's responses, attitude and cooperativeness although no concern apparent indicating he considered him dangerous Case placed in closed status by SA FAIN with report of 8/30/62, however as brought out in Dallas airtel 12/8/ this was done with arrangements made for reopening it when pending im ctive case on MARINA OSWALD was reopened.

Other than as brought out above there is no material in file specifically reflecting anything remarkable about OSWALD's demeanor noted by SA FAIN during second interview.

SA BROWN advises he knew little about background of OSWALD or of case and recollection is now vague. Can only state OSWALD in some ways seemed a little evasive but not billigerent and in the course of interview of OSWALD, BROWN did not note anything "remarkable" or indicative of possible dangerousness. SA BROWN is not a security agent.

#### Interview of SA JOHN W. FAIN (retired)

Former SA JOHN W. FAIN interviewed Houston, Texas., 3/31/64, by SAC WRIGHTMEYER and SA DAHLRIMPLE and furnished following comments concerning interviews of OSWALD in June, 1962 and August, 1962.

BAIN recalls interview on 6/26/62 conducted in Fort Worth FBI Office with SA B. TOM CARTER present. Throughout OSWALD curt and abrupt and when questioned for details became arrogant and stated to effect did not want to relive past. OSWALD generally uncooperative throughout interview. Investigations at that point and results of this interview developed no apparent basis for believing OSWALD represented potential for acts of violence. FAIN recalls setting out lead for reinterview of OSWALD at later date. FAIN recalls second interview on 8/16/62 was conducted with assistance of SA BROWN. Interview conducted in Bureau automobile and lasted approximately one hour. Subject was intercepted as he approached his residence at 2703 Mercedes, Fort Worth, in order to insure privacy of interview. This was in nature of follow up interview. No particular reason for date selected for this interview. During August, 1962 interview FAIN noted nothing remarkable about OSWALD during interview but subject continued to play down possibility Soviet government would be interested in him. OSWALD promised to advise FBI in event he should be contacted by representative of Soviet Intelligence. Nothing OSWALD said during this interview gave any reason to believe subject was potentially violent or dangerous person.

At 7:05 p.m., 3/31/64, Supervisor ANDY DECKER of the Bureau telephonically referred to New Orleans teletype, 3/31/64, 3:49 p.m. He requested in regard to question 15 to be advised why the information obtained from Mrs. JENNIE RODGERS was concealed in one New Orleans report and was not concealed in the other. He stated that questions 19, 20, and 25 according to the New Orleans teletype were to be bandled separately and he requested that the answers to these questions be obtained and furnished to the Bureau on the night of 3/31/64 along with the information concerning Mrs. JENNIE RODGERS inasmuch as the Bureau had a crew of men working to obtain the desired information for Mr. HOOVER on the morning of 4/1/64.

At 7:38 p.m. DECKER was telephonically advised that when SA DE BRUEYS submitted his report concerning the Fair Play for Cuba Committee on 10/25/63 the report was submitted in SA KAACK's absence. DE BRUEYS recognized that the information coming from Mrs. JENNIE RODGERS came from a radio station and, therefore, a question of concealment of her identity arose. Since SA KAACK was absent, SA DE BRUEYS resolved the question of concealment of identity in favor of concealing Mrs. RODGERS' identity. DECKER advised that this information was sufficient for the Bureau's purposes.

In regard to questions 19, 20, and 25, DECKER was advised that New Orleans had already prepared a teletype which was about to be run off for the Bureau containing the answers to these questions. DECKER stated it was not necessary to read this teletype to the Bureau as long as the teletype was sent immediately.

Clerk OTIS PAGE sent the teletype to the Bureau immediately after I had completed my call with DECKER.



> Attorney LEO W. ROUSSELLE/telephonically advised that he represents a Mrs. BOUDREAUX who resides on Pauline Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, who has previously been interviewed by the FBI in connection with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He advised that Mrs. BOUDREAUX had received a letter from the Chief Attorney of the Warren Commission, indicating that an attorney by the name of LIBLE or LEIBLE would contact her on April 6, 1964. Mr. ROUSSELLE stated he had no additional information other than that there were a number of attachments to the letter which was described to him by Mrs. BOUDREAUX. He, himself has not seen the letter and does not know whether this is to be a public hearing or merely a preliminary investigation to screen witnesses.

> Mr. ROUSSELLE stated that Mrs. BOUDREAUX told him that OSWALD had lived in her neighborhood and remarked that she still had OSWALD's baby bed.

I also read to BRANIGAN the interviewed conducted with Mrs. BOUDREAUX which is set out on page 74 of the report of SA STEPHEN M. CALLENDER dated 12/10/63 at New Orleans.

BRANIGAN stated he did not anticipate the New Orleans Office would receive any request from representatives of the Commission but that if a request is received for any information or investigation, such should be cleared telephonically with the Bureau prior to taking any action.

On 4/3/64 at 4:20 p.m. Supervisor W. A. BRANIGAN of the Bureau called the New Orleans Office and advised the Bureau was mailing a copy of the proposed letter to the President's Commission which contains the proposed answers to the thirty questions previously submitted to New Orleans and Dallas. BRANIGAN requested that New Orleans review the answers to the questions in above referenced communication, have the Agents carefully go over such questions for accuracy and thereafter advise the Bureau of any inaccuracies or suggested changes. BRANIGAN stated the letter should be mailed on the afternoon of 4/3/64 and should be received in New Orleans on 4/4/64. He requested that this matter be handled immediately upon receipt of above communication.

SAS KAACK, QUIGLEY, deBRUEYS and CALLENDER were thereafter advised and requested to be available on Saturday morning.

On 4/4/64 the above mentioned letter was received and was carefully reviewed by the aforementioned Agents. After noting there were no inaccuracies or suggested changes, Mr. BRANIGAN was so advised telephonically at 1:30 p.m., 4/4/64.

While talking to Mr. BRANIGAN on 4/3/64 he advised that in connection with the incorrect date in SA deBRUEYS' report on the FPCC it would be necessary to fix responsibility, submit memo of explanation and recommendation for disciplinary action.
