For the information of Agents receiving copies of this memorandum a grey jacket has been identified by witnesses as the property of captioned Subject. This jacket has been identified by the Laboratory as K-42. An examination of the jacket disclosed that on the inside of the collar neck band there was a laundry mark "30 030". The first two numbers "30" appear to have been handprinted and then there is a space and the last three numbers "030" appeared to have been printed by a machine in black color.

Also attached to the lower part of this jacket by two staples is a dry cleaners tag bearing the marking "B9738". Investigation has determined that this cleaning tag was printed by a "Tag-o-lectric" type of marking machine. Investigation to date has been unable to locate any laundry using this type of marking machine.

Cleaners and laundries in the area of Oswald's residence 4907 Magazine Street, New Orleans, La. have been contacted with negative results concerning the above marks.

The Bureau has instructed that all laundries and dry cleaning establishments be contacted in an effort to identify the laundry and dry cleaning marks. The Bureau has also instructed that this investigation be handled expeditiously.

Attached are xerox copies of the yellow pages of the telephone directory setting for identities of dry cleaning and laundry establishments.

Agents receiving this memo should contact the establishment attached to these names and conduct the following investigation.

Dry Cleaning Establishments

1. Determine if they use a "tag-o-lectric" machine in marking dry cleaning tags.
2. Ascertain what markings they use on dry cleaning and if they use the marking indicated above. Ascertain if "B9738" means anything to them.
3. Obtain name and position of person contacted.

Laundries

1. Obtain name and position of person interviewed.
2. Obtain method of used in marking garments.
3. Ascertain if marking "30 030" means anything to them.

Above investigation must be completed by 5/2/64

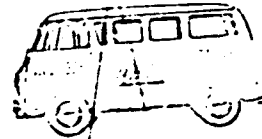

FOR ATTACKS, SABOTAGE**Free Hands of Cuban Exiles,
Former Official Urges Here**

Free the hands of Cubans in Florida to attack and sabotage the Communists who have stolen our country," pleaded Dr. Jorge Garcia-Montez, former prime minister of Cuba, in a speech yesterday before the Louisiana Press Association.

Dr. Garcia-Montez addressed approximately 200 delegates to the 84th annual convention of the association being held at La Sande Western Hills in Bossier City on his first trip outside of Florida.

"Cubans buy boats and fix them up with their own money to go to Cuba to sabotage the Castro government, and the Coast Guard stops them," Dr. Garcia-Montez said. He also said there was a move on the part of the U.S. government to disperse the Cuban refugees in Florida to other cities so that they cannot operate.

Dr. Garcia-Montez said a military invasion of the island led by exiled Cubans and the United States would be justified by the Monroe Doctrine and through the OAS treaties at Caracas, Bogota and Rio de Janeiro.

"From the reports of refugees arriving every week, and smuggled letters, I estimate that 80 per cent of Cubans are against the Castro regime," he said.

"There is an underground, but conditions in the police state make it almost impossible for it to operate effectively.

"In every block in the city of Havana and other cities, a man is delegated to keep track of all visitors to each house and report to the police. It is very hard to have meetings in these conditions," he said.

Inflammatory speeches against the United States and President Kennedy by Castro helped incite Lee Oswald to assassinate the President, Montez said. Oswald was a devoted Fidelista as was proved by his activities in New Orleans before the assassination, and he must have known of Castro's speeches in which he said

he feared a rapprochement between Russia and the United States and called the president "a ruffian" and leaders of the United States "gangsters and pirates," Montez said.

"I do not say that Castro induced Oswald to murder President Kennedy," he said. "What I do say is that the peculiar brand of Castro's Communist ideology was responsible for that murder of the President of the United States."

"If Castro would not have been helped by the United States government to win power, or if his regime would have been suppressed at the Bay of Pigs or before, the President of the United States would be alive today," he stated.

At a breakfast meeting yesterday, Gus Weill, executive secretary to Gov.-Elect John McKeithen, predicted the administration which will take over next month will "convert Louisiana into a model state in a short time."

"The next four years should be the best our beloved state has ever seen," Weill said. "John McKeithen will bring a forthright, honest government to Baton Rouge."

Weill said McKeithen has given top priority to a list of tax re-

forms which will be introduced at the 60-day legislative session which opens May 11, the day before the governor's inauguration. These reforms said Weill will be aimed at "putting Louisiana on a competitive basis with neighboring states in attracting new industry and in meeting the needs of industry already established in the state.

"Arkansas and Texas are passing us by in bringing new industry to their states," Weill said, "and the trend must be reversed."

A briefing by the Tactical Air Command was also held yesterday, and a film on Hodges Gardens was shown at the luncheon meeting at which Dr. Garcia-Montez spoke. The two-day convention winds up today with a breakfast meeting of the board of directors.

On 5/15/64 [redacted] advised that CARLOS JOSE BRINGUIER, also known as CARLOS JOSE BRINGUIER-ESPOSITO, 501 Adele St., Apt. F, and delegate to the Directorio Revolucionario Estudiantil (DRE) (translated: Student Revolutionary Directorate), had mentioned before he left on a trip on 5/7/64 that he was writing a book, the termination of which seemed to carry a great deal of urgency. This book is believed to be about LEE HARVEY OSWALD and the establishment of a relationship between OSWALD and Fidel Castro of Cuba; there will apparently be no actual facts on which to support this conclusion according to [redacted] but that there will probably be a recitation of certain incidents that will be used to create doubt that OSWALD acted alone in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. [redacted] cautioned that BRINGUIER did not outline the theme of the book to [redacted] but rather this is the conclusion that [redacted] has drawn based on comments made by Bringuiier. BRINGUIER did definitely state he was writing a book which he is in a hurry to conclude.
