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The following information was supplied on November 24, 1964 , by Mrs. ELENA GARSO DS PAZ and her daughter, ELENA PAZ GARRD.

They are residents of Mexico City, but declined to supply their hone address. Mrs. PAZ stated she is a COUSIn of RUBEN, LIDIA, and HORACIO DURAN, the latter being the husband of SIIVIAMTMRADO DEMDUSAI. She said she had not furnished previously the information set forth hereinafter because of tear of reprisals.

Mrs. PAZ said that on August 23, 1963, she attended a dinner at the home of a Mexican Communist whom she declined to identify. Along others present at this dinner were Cuban Consul RUSKBIQ. AZCUE and his wife. She had not previously known AZCUS. In conversation with him during the course of the evening she learned that he was supposed to return to Cuba on or about August 27, 1963. She later learned that he did not depart Mexico at that time.

According to Mrs. PAZ, she had infrequent contact with her cousins, the DURANS; however, on a date she fixed $\lambda$ as Saturday, September 28,1963 , she received a colophons call from RUBEN DURAN, who invited her and her daughter to attend a party at his house during the first part of the following week. She was unable to fix the expect date of this party, but felt it had been held on Monday, Tuesday, -1 or Wednesday, September 30, October 1, and October 2, 1963, respectively, with the most likely possibility that it was held on the evening of October 1 or October 2, 1963.

It mas Mrs. PAZ' recollection that at about - COPIES DESTROYED

9:00 m.m. on the date of the party ohe and her daughter were: picked up and taken to the party by LIDIA DURaN. Also Gccompanying them was Mrs. PAZ' sister, DSVA GARPO DS Cho who was expelled from the Party for bsing a Catholic.

She estimatod that some thirty people attended the party, described as a "twist" party, at the home of RUBEN DURAN. Upon arrival at RUBEN's home she noted what appeared to be a young American couple near the door, but they left shortly thereafter.

At about 10:30 p.m. three ycung, white Americans arrived at the party. They were greete.t b- SILTIA DURAN and spoke only to her. They more or lisir isol.ated thenselves from the rest of the party and insofar as she ctserved they had no conversation (ith anyone else at the party.

The three Americans appeared to be betreen twenty-two and twenty-four years of age. One of them was dressod in a sweater and dark trousers and appeared to be \&boitt five feet nice inches in height. The second one fios about six feet tall, bad blond, straight hair, a long ciin, ani vias a bit "beatnik" in appearance although his drecis included a coat. The third American wore no coat.

Urs. PAZ said the American dressed in the sucktry and dark trousers resembled very much press photographs of LEE HARVEY OSTALD. Her daughter agreed with finis obscrvation. Photographs of OSHALD in various poses were exhibited to both Krs. PAZ and her daughter at the time of the interview and thes were unable to make a positive identification, but claimed he very much resembled. the American at the party as they recall him.

Mrs. PAZ could not state how long the three Americans remained at the party nor did she observe them When they departed. She questioned HORACIO DURAN as te the names of the Amsricans, and he told her they were iriends of SILVIA DURAR. He did not give her thoir names, but did tell her they wore supposed to depart Moxico City the following morning. She added that this latter was not correct inasmuch as she and her danghter, whils driving in an automobile on Insurgentes Street the following morning, observed the three Americans walking near 2 furniture store on that street.

It is to be noted that investigation has establisbed that LEE HARVEY OSWALD departed Mexico City by bus at 8:30 a.m. on October 2, 19G3, and could not have been identical With the American allegediy observed by His. PAZ at the party if this party were held on the evening of October 1 or October 2, 1963.

Mrs. PAZ was questioned regarding the identity of other persons attending the party at the RJEEN DURAN home who might have been in a position to observe the three Americans. She said that in the courss of the party her daughter met a young man named "ALEJANDSD" at the party and danced with him. He was apparently quite saitten with the daughter and tried to call her on several occasions after the party. The daughter did not take the calls and as $\approx$ result "ALEJABDRO" wrote several letters to the daughter. Mrs. PAZ exhibited two of these letters, as well as a business card which identified the young man as ARIO ALEJANDRO LAVAGNINI STENIUS.

An examination of the letter which Mrs. PAZ said was the first directed to her daughter by the young man disclosed that it bears the date of September 1,1053 , and was postmarked at the Kexico City Post Office on September 2, 1963.

Questioned as to whether her daughter had known the young man prior to the party at the RUBEN DURAN home, Mrs. PAZ was most. insistent that she had pot. When it was pointer out to her that the first letter from the young man to her daughter bore a Mexico City postmark of September 2, 1963, she commented that probably the Communists have facilities for falsifying postmarks.
$\%$ On November 27, 1964, ARIO ALEJANDRO LAVAGNINI BTENIUS, Martinez de Castro No. 19, Tacubaya, Mexico, D. F., Mexico, was interviewed. He advised that be is an employee of General Electric de Mexico and recalled attending a largeparty sometime in the latter half of 1963 at the apartment of RUBEN DURAN located on Herodoto Street in Mexico City. He was not a friend of the DURAN family, but had been invited to the party by Krs. ISABEL NANSON, a divorcee who was formerly married to an American and a close friend of the wife of RUBEN DURAN. An Italian friend of his, MARCELLO FABRE, was also invited to the party by Mrs. NANSON. He, Mrs. NANSON, and FABRE went to the party together.

LAVAGNINI recalled that there were about shirty people at the party, fery of whom he knew. At ti:c parts he met a Mexican girl who had recently returned frin living in: France. He was unable to $11 x$ the date of the praty, but felt it was probably early in September bocause of a heavy rain which occurred as they were leaving the party et about 2:00 2.m.

LAVAGNTNI noted no Americans proci=t at this narty. He was familiar with the appearance of LE\& IIANEY OSTMAD because of publicity following the assasciration of Prabident EEiNEDY, but otherwiss had no knowledge of hin find had never seen him except for news photographs following the asiessination.

He volunteered to consult his papors and attcmpt to fix the date of the party. On December 2, 1954, he advised that he recalled having been at two different parties at the DIIRAN home, one of these being the large party at which he had met the Mexican girl who had formorly livec in France. He was unable to fix the date of this party.

LAVAGNINI said he had questioned trs. NANSON and MARCELLO FABRE, and they were unable to recail tha date of the party nor could they recall that any Americans had been present at the party.
 those concerning OSWALD's activities while in Mexico City.

Mrs. PAZ and her daughter readily identified photographs of the members of the DURAN family and of EUSEBIO AZCUE. Photographs of OSMALD in different poses were exhibited to them along with photographs of several individuals completely unconnected with the OSWALD case. While they picked out some of the photographs of OSWALD as resembling the American, they saw at the party in the RUBEN DURAN home, they did not make a positive identification and it is to be noted it would have been quite easy to pIck out the OSWALD photographs because of the numerous press photographs of him which appeared in Mexico City newspapers following the President's assassination.

Mrs. PAZ and her daughter appeared to be somewhat Bohemian. Mrs. PAZ, herself, while denying she was ever a Comunist, stated that in former jears she had taken, an active part in promoting agrarian reform in the state of Morelos in order that poor peasants might be granted land. She mentioned the names of numerous Mexican liberals and leftists with whom she has been acquainted in the past.

As has been mentioned, Mrs. PAZ' conversation during the interview was quite rambling and the impression was gained by the interviewing agents that she might not be. completely stable. Despite her request that her identity and that of her dafigter be concealed, their names have been included in the have no meaniorandum since it.is felt the memorandum would

Perez Sancho, helped By another refugee named Ezequiel Benedicto Izquierdo and a Lawyer By the Last name of oropeza. all this group knows more about Kennedy's death than you think.
the Leader Pique perez Benin made several trips to Tijuana at Lower California, he said that was to fix a Hotel at Ensenada a Town Below Tijuana, gut I know that he interviewed oswald and some other gays of the Communist Party. Because he

On May 31, 1965, T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the identification records maintained at the Monterrey Police Department and at the Nuevo Leon State Police Department, contained no references whatsoever to the name oi MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS.

On June 1l, 1965, T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he made discreet neighborhood inquiries concerning NIGUEI FONSECA RIVAS, and he ascertained trat FONSECA is a young man, reporiediy emplojed

as a waiter, wio resides with his mother at Tecate 120, Colonia Las Mitras. He said neighbors appeared to know very little about FONSECA, contending that he was antisocial and had very little contact with anyone in the neighborhood. He stated the neighbors advised him FONSECA was employed as a waiter, but no one could furnish the name of the establishment. where he worlced. MEX-33 said FONSECA was considered in the neighborhood to be somewhat odd.

On June 22, \(=95 j, T-2\) auvised that FONSECA was not listed as a member of the waiters' union in Monterrey, and he was not known to administrative officers of the union.

On July 31, 1965, T-3, who has furnished reliable - Information in the past, reported that FONSECA and his mother live alone at Tecate ?.20, Colonia Las Mitras, and that neither of them has much contact with neichbors. He said it was the general conientius in the neluhborhood that fenijicn wai not well adjusted mentally and the neighbors avoided his company in the same nanner that rONSECA appeared to detach himself from them. T-3 Eaid that while it was generally believed in the neighborhood that FONSECA was employed as a waiter, he had encountered no one who could identify the establishment in which FONSECA worked. T-3 stated that no one in the neighborhood seemed able to iurnish any background information concerning FONSECA, and all those he contacted commented upon FONSECA's alleged mental condition.

On August 31, 1965, T-3 advised that he had on August 20, 1965, located and interviewed MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS at the place of his employment, the Club Reno. He said FONSECA told him he had been previously employed at the Hotel Del Parque in Cuernavaca, Morelos, Mexico, and that he had seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD at that hotel accompanied iy the hotel Owner, FNRICIJEXEPEZ, BONIN, PEPEZ' son ENRIQUS PEREZ SSANCHO, EZFRUIEL, BENEDICTO:IZQUIERDO, and two other unidentified individuals. T-3 said FONSECA alleged that the individual believed by him to have been OSWALD was royally treated at the Hotel Del Parque, ail of which appeared strange to FONSECA because of alieged previously displayed anti-American attitudes

T-3 said FONSICA advised he had reviewed the Warren Report relating to the assassination of president KENNEDY and when he had encountered'. no mention of OSWALD's alleged visit to Cuernavaca, he had written a letter to Washington, D. C. He said FONSECA advised he would welcome an opportunity to disclose all he knew of OSWALD's alleged visit to Cuernavaca to a properly authorized representative of the United states GJvisument.

T-3 advised that FONSECA expressed great bitterness toward ENRIOUE PEREZ BONIN and tine Hotel Del Marque. T-3 described FONSECA as having an effeminate, waspish and vindictive manner.

T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available the following information on \(9 / 29 / 65\).

The following people were interviewed in Cuernavaca, Mo: el os, Mexico: ENRIQUE PEREZ BONIN, his son EIRIQUE PEREZ SANCHO, and Attorney GUELEERIUO:OROPEZA. PEREZ BONIN is the owner of the Hotel? Del parque located in the principal plaza In Cuernavaca. According to PEREZ BONIN, LEE HARVEY OSWALD had ne jer been a guest in his hotel in Cuernavaca and so far \(a 3\) was known was never in the city of cuernavaca. OROPELA, PEREZ BONIN, and PEREZ SANOHO all advised that the had never seen or heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD prior to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENIEDY but, of course, after the assassinnation \(0:\) Presicient KENNEDY, due to the wide publ: city involved, they all becai.1e aware of LEE HARVEY OSWALD as the assassi:1 of President KENNEDY. PEREZ ZONIN, PERZZ SANCHO, and OROPEZA all advised that if they had had any information. 1 relating to the assassination of President KEMNEDY, they would have immediately advised the United States Government.

With regard to MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS, PEREZ BONIN advised that FONSICA had for about a year managed another hotel, the Villa Galeaza, which was the property of PiriEZ BONIN. This was in 1962-1963; however, PEREZ BONIN became
