

Kenneth Jess Porter was given permission this week to pick up a wine and beer license for his proposed bar and grill.

County Judge W. L. Sterrett said Dallas police withdrew their protest of the license after Porter assured them that his wife, the former Mrs. Lee Harvey Oswald, his no interest in the venture.

"If there is no protest, he can pey any time he wants to," said Judge Sterrett.

A license hearing was postponed Tuesday when the vice squad of the Special Service Bureau pointed out that an alien cannot hold a beer license. Mrs. Porter was born in Russia.

Porter signed an affidavit stating that he will be the sole operator of Ken's Grill and Bar, 3230 Knox. New Life

RICHARDSON, Texes (UPI)—The remarried widow of the man who shot President John F. Kennedy is still as shy and uncommunicative as she was nearly a decade ago when the assassination thrust her into the world spotlight.

"I'm sick but that's not for publication," Marina Oswald Porter said during a telephone call to her modest home in this Dalias suburb. "I don't want to give you any information. Goodbye."

Mrs. Porter, 32, did sound as though she had a bad cold. Despite that, there was a noticeable change in her speech -now almost without an acbent.

When Lee Harvey Oswald gunned down Kennedy from a sixth floor window of the Tcxas School Book Depository in Dalias Nov. 22, 1963, Marina spoke only Russian. She had been a pharmacist in Russia when she married Oswald two years before the essassination.

Mrs. Porter and her second husband, Kenneth Jess Forter, 35, live in a red brick home with a shingle rooi in Richardson. There are trees in the yard and the lawn is greening under the spring sunshine.

She has three childrendaughters June, 11, and Rachel, 9, by Oswald, and a son, Mark, 7, by Porter.

Apparently she does not mix well. People in Richardson know little or nothing about her.

A woman who exchanges greetings frequently with her at a supermarket said she is a domestic type "who makes a lot of her own clothes and likes for her children to chew sugarless gum."

The 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled recently in New Orieans that the American government must pay her \$17,729 for some 500 small personal articles that belonged to Oswald. The items have been placed permanently in the U.S. Archives.

MOST highly valued of

the articles was Oswald's diary, valued at \$5,000.

In the diary, Oswald tells how he married Marina Prusskova "to hurt Ella." Ella (family name unknown) was a Russian girl who spurned Oswald. Oswald lived in Russia from January, 1950, until May, 1952, after his discharge from the Marine Corps.

Marina married Porter, a twice divorced electronics technician, in 1955. Shortly after the marriage Porter went into business as the operator of a bar. That did not work out, and at last report, he was repairing sewing machines.

Except for one incident about six months after the marriage, the Porters have not had any marita! problems that attracted public attention.

In November, 1965, the bride went to Justice of the Peace Bill Richburg and complained:

"We got into an argument today. He slapped me in the face and tried to get me to put the children outside so he could be alone with the gun he carried. I am afraid he might try to do me bodily harm."

Richburg put Porter under \$1,500 peace bond. Porter returned to Marina and no further incidents have been reported.

Mrs. Porter has been able to supplement her second husband's income with some other windfalls that resulted from Oswald's infamy. Before she married Porter, sympathetic Americans had sent her about \$60,000.

WITH a collaborator, she subsequently wrote a book that apparently did not sell well. She sold her rights to the rifle her husband used to kill Kennedy and the pistol with which he killed a policeman, to a collector for \$11,-350.

The government has the rifle and pistol and is expected to keep them.

Erich F. Klein Jr., her lawyer, said she has not potten the S17.729 the U.S. Circuit

Court awarded her. He said of her:

"She is a shy thing. I don't get to talk to her but once in every three years maybe."

The only real interview Mrs. Porter has ever given was for money. It was with Redbook magazine, which published the interview in August, 1970. EV. her. "I don't need publicity. should be sent for one year to I'm not a movie star. I don't Russia to work. like publicity. It has done me nothing but harm."

In the interview, Mrs. Porter said that when her daughter June was in the second grade, the class studied the life of President Konnedy. . During a discussion, June ' try has its faults and probvolunteered, "My first daddy ; killed him."

a fact, you know," Mrs. Por- the United States."-ter was quoted. "Something she knew and should perhaps tell."

SHE SAID she was afraid that if she did not tell June before she started school that her father had killed the President, somebody else, would. "The first week Junie went to school, I talked to her about it," Mrs. Porter said. "I have to open my mouth because I am afraid if somebody tells her before me, she will be hurt more.

"Oh, it was the hardest thing. We cried a little. Then she asked some questions, and I answered, so that she won't have the wrong feelings."

She said she loved Oswald when she married him.

"His mind became sick. I do not know if it was politics," she said.

She said she gets homesick for Russia but believes the United States to be the best country in the world.

"There is too much democracy here," she said. "The people want too much. They want too much to be given. We have this freedom of speech, so we ask for everything. People do not appreclate what they have. The
