Assistant to the Director ALAN H. BELMONT called at 5:00 PN today and advised as follows:

The Bureau has been informed that Dist. Atty. HENRY WADE, in his recent appearance before representatives of the President's Commission to investigate the assassination of President Kennedy, made the statement that Dallas reporter HUDKINS claims OSWALD was known as Informant No. 179 in the Bureau and was paid \$200.00 a month. The Commission asked WADE what he knew about informants in the FBI, and he said that when he was in South America as a Bureau representative, he was given money and never had to get receipts; that the Bureau depended upon his integrity to spend the money properly, and there was no accounting for the money. The inference, of course, is that under these circumstances, the Bureau would not know at headquarters whether OSWALD had been an informant and had been paid as there is no accounting for the money.

The Commission said it was desirous of knowing how they could run this out and present a convincing picture to the effect that OSWALD was not a Bureau informant, and it was suggested to them that they call HUDKINS and put him under oath, regardless of the fact that he might go back and write a story that the FBI was being investigated by the Commission.

We are preparing information here at the Seat of Government relative to the handling of informants and the accountability of funds - - that is, what our procedure is.

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Nr. BELMONT continued that the Director wanted him to pass on to you that he wanted you to be very circumspect in your dealings with WADE, inasmuch as by inference at least, WADE indicated that the Bureau was not in a position to state whether OSWALD was or was not an informant. As you know, this is not true as we account for all funds paid to informants or for information of any kind, and we have a strict accountability for the designation and handling of informants.

Hold WADE at arm's length. Don't give any advice or counsel, and while we want to cooperate to the extent that it is legally desirable so we can't be charged with lack of cooperation in connection with the RUBY matter, the Dallas Office should be very circumspect in its dealings with WADE. This information that we received does not parallel the information which WADE furnished you the other night about his appearance before the Commission. UNITED STATES GOVERN

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On 11/22/63 at approximately 12:35 PL, I was instructed by the SAC to proceed to Parkland Hospital and to immediately contact Secret Service Agents to establish liaison and to offer the Bureau's entire facilities and manpower for any assistance. I arrived at the hospital and established liaison with Secret Service Agent in Charge, first name not known, KELLERMAN, in the emergency ward.

At approximately 1:50 PM, with the assistance of the chief registered nurse on duty in the emergency ward, I was able to leave the area and to to another part of the hospital to telephonically contact the SAC. All outgoing telephone service on the first floor of the hospital was blocked and it was not possible to make any outside contact by telephone.

At approximately 1:59 PM, the head nurse and I cleared through police officers at the door leading down the corridor to one of the doors to the emergency ward, after I identified myself as an FEI Agent. I had previously identified myself to Secret Service Agents in the immediate emergency room area where President KENNEDY expired. As the chief registered nurse and I entered the emergency room door, returnregistered nurse and I entered the emergency room door, returning from the telephone call, two Secret Service Agents, without challenging me, grabbed me and wrestled me to the hall floor. I immediately identified myself again. At this point, Secret Service Agent in Charge KELLERMAN appeared, who knew me from previous identification by credentials, and the matter ended there.

Within the next few minutes I was able to get a phone and called the office and talked with ASAC CLARK, who was advised of the above. ASAC CLARK advised me that SA DRAIN was on the premises and had a line open through which 7-42 he could reach the office, and that it wouldn't REALMER CESSERED for me to stay any longer.

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Beveral minutes later, following a conversation with the on duty outside the immediate room door where the President was being attended, I identified myself to her by credentials and asked her if she knew where I could find a telephone in order to make an outside call. We departed the immediate area and proceeded some 25 feet north from the emergency room area to a corridor, and from the corridor door to the right for some 100 feet or more to another corridor, which was being guarded by two Dallas police officers. As we approached this door, we were challenged by the officers, and I identified myself by credentials to these officers in order to leave (h) (b) one corridor and to enter the other. The and I were unable to get on an elevator and she suggested that we proceed up the stairway. As we reached the second or third floor above the floor level we were on, we proceeded to the telephone switchboard room, where I again identified myself to the operator in charge of that room by credentials, explaining to this person that I had to make an emergency call to the FBI office in Dallas.

Within a few minutes, I was able to obtain a tele-phone line and I contacted ASAC KYLE G. CLARK. I explained the circumstances as I saw then at that time, pointing out that all telephones were blocked off and that it was not possible from within the hospital to relay any information to the office.

Land I Following this conversation, the (6)/6) proceeded back down the corridor and down the stairway to the floor level from which we came, and I was again requested by the Dallas police officers to identify myself by credentials before entering, which I did.

and I After clearing this door, the (6)(6) proceeded down the corridor to the door from which we had originally come, and started to enter the double doors. There were several people in the hall, whose identity I do not know. However, I do know there was no other FBI Agent among the group.

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As I approached the double doors, there was no officer, and the civilians standing by were not identified to me as Secret Service or any other law enforcement officer. The proceeded me through the door and as I started to enter, I was suddenly grabbed from behind by two unknown individuals and wrestled to the hall floor. I had not identified myself to anyone as I started to enter this door because I was not challenged or asked to identify myself to anyone. I immediately again identified myself by credentials to a police officer, who immediately stepped to my side, and to two individuals who indicated to me, but not by credentials, that they were Secret Service Agents. They did not give their names and did not show their credentials. At this point, Secret Service Agent KELLERMAN, whom I had previously identified myself to by credentials, appeared on the scene and the matter ended.

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At no time did I make any statement to anyone prior to reentering the above doors with the statement to as there was no need to do so. I had identified myself in all other instances by credential, and there was no reason not to have identified myself on this occasion, had I been asked to do so.

Reference is made to your letter 4/17/64 which enclosed copies of FD 255's recommending incentive awards for certain personnel of your office in connection with your coverage of Marina Oswald.

Reference is also made to Bureau letter dated 4/27/64 advising that such action was being deferred pending the outcome of the Commission's report .

For your information, Bureau does not feel that incentive awards are merited in this particular facet of this investigation.

LEE MARVEY OSVALD

WALTER JERKINS, Special Assistant to the President, told me on 4/29/64 that a friend of his had just returned from Dallas, Texas. In Dallas, JERKINS' friend had allegedly met with one of our Special Agents. This Agent had formerly been assigned to the New Orleans Office. The Agent told JENKINS' friend that he had been transferred from New Orleans as a result of getting into trouble with a woman in the French Quarter.

The alleged Agent also reportedly told JENKINS' friend that he assisted in the investigation of the OSVALD case and that QEVALD prior to his murder was definitely an FBI informant. The "Agent" stated that FBI files in Washington would prove this fact. I told JENNINS that while I doubted very seriously that any of our Agents had furnished this fact to his friend, that at the same time we, of course, would make a check and find out if the description given of this Agent fitted may of our people. I asked JENKINS if he would mind letting us interview his informant. He stated the information had been furnished him in confidence and he preferred not to reveal the identity of this fellow. He stated he wanted to let us know, however, that he had made it very clear to his friend that this was an old remor that had arisen time and again and that the FBI had branded it as being completely false. JENKINS stated there was no question in his mind regarding the falsity of this matter.

Despite the fact that this matter had been tied down as being false, it is considered desirable to review personnel files of Agents in Dallas to find out if any of the Agents have been transferred there from New Orleans for a type of disciplinary problem as described above. If there is such an Agent, he should be interviewed regarding this matter.

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NO OTHER AGENTS WOULD APPEAR TO FIT IN THIS CATEGORT. I have been asked if I have ever met with or conversed with any of my friends from Washington, D. C., in the past few weeks. In addition, I have been asked if I ever made the statement that prior to the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald he was definitely a Federal Bureau of Investigation informant and that the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington would prove this fact.

I have only a few friends residing in Washington, D. C. and I have not seen or visited any of these people in the past two or three years, Bor have they visited me in Dallas (6)(-(-))(-) since my arrival here during

At no time have I ever discussed or mentioned any facets of the investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy outside the office or on other than official business. At no time have I ever discussed, mocially or officially, the

possibility or probability of Lee Harvey Oswald ever having been an informant for the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I wish to further state that I have never discussed the reason for my transfer to Dallas with anyone.
