The attached Bronnen to Sullivan (GEB) 2/21/67 memo is a third-hand report of a phone conversation I had with Malodin Kilderff, who had been a White House press anorotary under JFK. This record, which beers an indexing work, the copy from the file that cannot be read and any other copies and any record of any distribution and/or distribution copies or versions should have been provided in response to my BA requests but none was.

From what I have observed of Fill practice, and particularly considering the impresdive array of top Fill brack to whom this was reuted, the information in some form would have been compunicated to at least Dallas and New Orleans, neither of which offices provided any relevant record under PA.

That such inconsequential information, if true, was worth the time of so many top officials, is not easy to believe. This leads as to wonder if there was any other rocord of any kind relating to the call from the Secret Service.

Whis kind of send does not appear to represent the best FMI reporting and I do not see how any higher official could have known what was being talked about - if I had sold that. Nor do I see how any one could have failed to note inquiry to learn that I might have sold that "arthest does not any.

finds also was two month prior to my first trip to New Orleans.

I had but one conversation with Kilduri' that I recall. It related to the Hanchester book from which the Kennedy family had not yet disassociated itself. Although irs. J. Kennody appears to have commissioned Hanchester's work the actual purpose of my call to Kilduri' was to encourage him to use any influence he had to lead to the disassociation of the President's family from the work. After I couldned my reasons Kilduri' was milent for a mount then teld me he would go to dem York in a few days, that nobedy would know where he would be staying, and hes I could reach him. By response was that I had no purpose other them the one I had accompliahed, of giving him this Manchester information, and would have no need to get in touch with him. (when Henre Salinger wrote an intro. to Charles Roberts propagands Salinger was hardly the one to phone.)

Resultive Kilduff asked no exactining about lies Orleans but I had no Garrison pipeline. Without doubt I offered him gooden to other information, related to the Henchester book, on which I had done such research and use to do more. So, I'm surprised that nothing about the actual conversation or its purpose is in this same and an further inclined to believe there should be other versions and/or same.
