Dear "r. Buckley,

Your letter of the 25rd is helpful and I thank you for it.

I pressue you will also include a schedule with each coming batch and will indicate the claims made for any complete withholdings.

You say (b)(5) was claimed for "candid documents about Mr. Thomson." You also say that in your opinion it is applicable. I suggest that to eliminate what I believe is isappropriate use of this summation you consult with Mr. Shea before all the records are processed rather than afterward, which could mean a considerable amount of extra work if I am correct, as my reading of recent appeals court decisions persuades no I am.

It has not been policy to withheld "candid converts" about these critical of the official account of the JFK assassination. Some pretty terrible distortions and outright fa brications about me were released. The official position is that we are all public figures. I can not easily believe that these comments about the mutty Themson are more defensiony then what has been disclassed about other critics. I believe Mr. Shee will confirm this if you phone him and elminate that problem as much in advance as is possible.

If you are willing, I believe I can help you with some of these matters. An extraordinay ascent of information is now public because the volume of records about that most algoificant event is great. I remamber a fair amount and can provably provide much of what is available that I do not remamber. If in the course of processing you keep a list of names for which you consider a (7)(C) claim and merely mention the names to my by phone, without providing any details, you violate no privacy and perhaps I can provide information. I have a competent young woman who assists as part-time. She can consult my files and we can provide you with what they reflect, including citations of what the Department has disclosed about many.

You may also want to remember that the Warren Consission published three indices. In its Report there is one of witnesses and another of proper names in the Report. In Volume 15 it has all the proper names mentioned in the testimony. The Mational Archives has the Commission's name files. These will contain all that the Commission disclosed about these people.

The Fai has copies of a selective index of the Commission's public record, which includes the several volumes of exhibits, prepared by Hrs. Sylvia Heagher. She has updated it to include some of the published material of the reent House Select Committee on Assassinations. It is to be published by Scarecrow Press if it has not yet been published. Mr. Shea can lond you typed copies of parts of the HSCA section which I gave his or I can land you sy copies.

I do believe that you can save such work and eliminate many problems by not putting them over for the overloaded appeals office to face.
