I got your letter today, glad to hear from you. Thanks for the kind note on my wife's operation—she's coming along real good. She had a good ^{deal} of pain for a couple of years before the operation, and she's actually feeling better now than before. Guess surgery was worthwhile.

You've probably had similar weather we've had. It's been screwy the last 2-3 weeks. In the 40's and 50's then the latest semi-blizzard.

I've enclosed copies of my correspondence with the FBI, James Hall was the man I was writing to. I wonder if they're really spending a lot of time trying to prevent release of a lot of material they have. Maybe they're afraid it will embarrass them for the public to see what they spent their time/money on, or else there is a fair amount of material they don't want to release because it is too sensitive. I'm sure there's a goodly amount on Hoffa and probably Earl Ruby and his work defending his brother. But I don't think that'd account for 750 pages!

I hope you can use these to show the FBI as being noncooperative. It's been over a year now since I started my request. Maybe they're too busy crushing crime and corruption to attend to the request (a little sarcasm there).

Hope this finds all well with you and everything going ok. Are you going to compile and publish another book? I'd like to know about it if you do.
