Inquiring as to any measures. Exceled Agents of this Burgau, who have conversed with Oswald in Dollas, Texas, have observed pholographs of the Individual referred to above and have Histoned to a recording of his voice. These Special Agents are of the opinion that the above-referred-to individual was not Lee Harvey Oswald.

A highly confidential cource of this Dureau advised that an individual identifying himself as Cowald on November 18, 1963, was in contact with the Soviet Embausy in Washington, D. C., at which time he referred to a recent meeting with Comrade Kostin at the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City. This individual indicated that he originally intended to visit the Embassy in Hawara, Cuba, where he would have had time to complete his business, hat that he had been vanible to do no. The furnished his address as Ean 625, Dullas, Words, oud dialmed to be the husband of Marina Nikoleavaa Cowald, a Soviet efficien and futher of Audrey Marina Cowald, bern October 20, 1963, et Dullas, Werns.

Oawald during provious interviews with FBI Agents chaimed to have married his wife, Marina Nikoleavan Oswald, nee Frusskova, at Minch, Russia, en April 20, 1961. He likewise claimed en American passport, number D002523, fasued at New Orleans, Louisiana, on June 25, 1963, for proposed travel of three months to one year as a fourist to England, France, Germany, Kelland, UCSR, Fisland, Haly, and Poland. He indicated an intention to depart from New Orleans foring the latter part of 1963.

Additional information developed by this Burcau indicated one Lee Oswald during September, 1982, was a subscriber to "The Worker" an east const communist newspaper.
