In precessing the abstract the FM unoritically duplicated the withholding in the underlying record, even though the Department itself had disclosed what is withhold.

The largest note added to the underlying rederm at FRIE, and the most prominent one is also emairoled. It reads "SHE P 2.) The first words on that page, not those emphasized by the FRI, are "TO ASSIST AGENT ON SCHE AT PURISO VALLARIA." This is a disear and sown you deny - that has long been public knowledge but the FRI, the Department and even you deny - that the FRI was operational in Mexico. There thus is no legitimacy to any MINION claim of secrecy to "proofest foreign operations." Withheldings on this claim also are unjustifiable. The record also refers to other FRI investigations in Mexico.

Excisions have been made in some abstracts and sixteen have been withheld in their entirety pursuant to one or more of the following subsections of Title 5, United States Code, Section 552, as noted in the margins beside each deletion:

- (b)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to Executive Order 12065 in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy;
- (b)(3) information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency documents which are not available through discovery proceedings during litigation; or documents whose disclosure would have an inhibitive effect upon the development of policy and administrative direction; or which represent the work of an attorney-client relationship;
- (b)(6) materials contained in sensitive records such as personnel or medical files, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;

- (b)(7) investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the disclosure of which would:
 - (C) constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of another person;
 - (D) reveal the identity of an individual who has furnished information to the FBI under confidential circumstances or reveal information furnished only by such a person and not apparently known to the public or otherwise accessible to the FBI by overt means.

Exemption (b)(3) was cited pursuant to Title 28, United States Code, Section 534, to withhold criminal identification records.

If you so desire, you may appeal to the Associate Attorney General from any denial contained herein. Appeals should be directed in writing to the Associate Attorney General (Attention: Office of Privacy and Information Appeals), United States Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. 20530, within thirty days from receipt of this letter. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal" or "Information Appeal."
