

Many appeals - Murkin Bulkies

Dear Mr. Shea,

I write again about one of your unkept 1978 promises in C.A. 75-1996. You promised that I would be provided with a copy of the entire MURKIN bulky exhibit. I ask for it again promptly because I need it now to be able to inform my counsel accurately about what I regard as important issues pertaining to compliance, character of the searches and FBI truthfulness or untruthfulness, under oath pertaining to the searches and compliance.

There should be no doubt about my purposes or the immediacy of my need for the entire bulky. I have just reviewed records which bear on false representations under oath by SAs Wiseman and Kilty. It is possible that the bulky, if closely examined, may indicate that the testimony was not false.

Because of the urgency I ask that you inform me by phone whether or not I will now receive this overdue bulky and if I will, when to expect it.

By way of background, the bulky is the last HQ MURKIN record processed in this litigation. At the time, which was prior to the fee waiver, I was ill and weak. Instead of doing as it had with all other HQ MURKIN records, just copying it for me, the FBI made an exception to its consistent practice and offered it to me for examination. That was then beyond my capabilities, so I asked SA ^{harp} to provide copies of those portions in which I had indicated an interest. After examining what was provided I informed the FBI that pertinent information was not provided. Thereafter you informed me that the entire bulky would be provided. Since then I have asked for it a number of times.
