

**AD IN DALLAS PAPER
IS PUT UP TO F.B.I.**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29 (AP)—A Federal Bureau of Investigation inquiry into the American Fact-Finding Committee of Dallas was requested today by Representative Bernard F. Grabowski, Democrat of Connecticut, and Representative Silvio O. Conte, Republican of Massachusetts.

The committee was shown as the sponsor of a full-page advertisement in The Dallas Morning News on the day President Kennedy was assassinated.

The Representatives described the ad as "vicious, cruel and abusive and the kind of malicious verbiage that tends to incite fanatics."

Executives of the Dallas paper said that the publisher, Ted Dealey, and The News would have no comment.

The advertisement was signed by Bernard Weismann, chairman of the committee.

Mr. Weismann does not appear in either the City Directory or the telephone directory in Dallas. Efforts to locate him have been unavailing.
