

F.B.I. Hopes to Compile Assassination Data Soon

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2 (AP)—The Federal Bureau of Investigation hopes to send to President Johnson this week its report on the assassination of President Kennedy and the subsequent slaying of the man accused of firing the fatal shots.

It will be a narrative account in minute detail of the events surrounding the two deaths. If it follows the pattern of other F.B.I. investigative reports, it will stick to positive statements of what happened, dismissing baseless rumors by not mentioning them.

Much of the report will be a repetition of accounts that already have appeared in the press. It is expected to state that Lee H. Oswald, acting alone, killed Mr. Kennedy, and that Jack Ruby, acting alone, shot Oswald.

How the report will be made public is up to Mr. Johnson. He has promised the public every detail.
