

SCOFFER AT KENNEDY IN AD QUILTS DALLAS

DALLAS, Dec. 3 (AP)—The landlady of a man who bought an advertisement that gibed at President Kennedy the day he was assassinated said today that her tenant had "left unexpectedly last week." He said he was going to New York, Miss Dean Roberts, manager of an apartment house, said.

She said Bernard Weissman and his roommate had left last Wednesday night and "told me their forwarding address would be in care of general delivery, New York City." Mr. Kennedy was assassinated Nov. 22.

The advertisement was placed in The Dallas Morning News by a man who identified himself as Mr. Weissman, chairman of the American Fact-Finding Committee.

The ad, which has prompted demands from Congressmen for an investigation of the committee, said the committee demanded answers to 12 questions "and we want to know now."

One question asked:

"Have you [Kennedy] ordered or permitted your brother, Bobby, the Attorney General, to go soft on Communists, fellow travelers and ultra leftists in America, while permitting him to persecute loyal Americans who criticize you, your administration and your leadership?"
