DALLAS, Dec. 5 (UPI)—How did the President look to the shiper in the window? A photographic re-enactment yesterday of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy showed a perfect target.

A 35 mm. camera was rigged up with a four-power telescopic gun sight, similar to the one used by the sniper. The camera was held where the rifle was held, in the sixth floor southeast corner window of the Texas School Book Depository overlooking Elm Street. It was roughly the same time of day.

At the approximate distance p the shooting—between 75 and 100 yards—United Press International photographer Jerry A McNeill snapped the camera. This is the time it was estimated that it took the amper to live his shots at the President.
