

Head of Bar Group Says Oswald Was 'Lynched'

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 10 (UPI) — Theodore Voorhees, chancellor-elect of the Philadelphia Bar Association, said today that Lee H. Oswald had been "lynched."

Mr. Voorhees added that this was a "heavy indictment" against the legal profession for its alleged failure to protect the rights of President Kennedy's alleged assassin. Oswald was shot to death in the Dallas police station.

Addressing a luncheon meeting here Mr. Voorhees said "it is against the legal profession, not television or the press, that the heavy indictment must lie."

Although some concern was expressed that Oswald be provided counsel, he said, no member of the legal profession "protested the publication of the evidence, the 24-hour interrogation, the violations of the prisoner's rights."
