DALLAS, Dec. 18—Dr. Malcolm O. Perry, a surgeon at Parkland Hospital who attended President Kennedy shortly after he was shot, said today that physicians seeking to save the President's life noted that he had been wounded in the throat and head but did not seek to trace the course of the bullets.
He said the President was on his back from the time he arrived at the hospital until his body was removed.
