

# KENNEDY DEATH BOARD TO HEAR N.Y. LAWYER

WASHINGTON (AP)—The presidential commission investigating the assassination of President John F. Kennedy said Monday it will hear testimony Wednesday from Mark Lane, attorney for the accused assassin's mother. Lane, a New York attorney, was with Mrs. Marguerite Oswald when she appeared last month before the commission headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren to claim that her son, Lee Harvey Oswald, was a U.S. intelligence agent who was set up to take the blame for the assassination. Federal authorities have denied that Oswald was any such agent.

After three days of testimony, Mrs. Oswald went to New York, explaining she planned to work with Lane in trying to point out flaws in the case the government has been building against her son.
