

Oswald's Movements Traced by Commission

WASHINGTON (AP) — The commission investigating the assassination of President John F. Kennedy traced in detail Thursday the movements of Lee Harvey Oswald, the alleged assassin, right after the shooting. The witnesses were Cecil J. McWatters, a bus driver, and William Wayne Whaley, a cab driver, who had picked up Oswald after the shooting.

The witnesses themselves would not discuss their testimony with reporters, but Whaley said that "nothing is changed" from the previous story he had told. The commission said that today's witnesses will be Mr. and Mrs. Declan P. Ford and Peter Gregory. It identified them only as being acquainted with the Oswalds on their return from the Soviet Union.
