

WITNESS SAYS HE SAW OSWALD KILL TIPPIT

WASHINGTON (AP)—Four witnesses told the Warren Commission Thursday they saw Lee Harvey Oswald near the scene when Dallas policeman J. D. Tippit was killed after the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

One of the witnesses said he actually saw the shooting. Allen Dulles, a member of the commission, told reporters. "The others heard the shots and arrived on the scene while Oswald was still in the vicinity," Dulles said. They saw Oswald at or about the time of Tippit's killing, he said.

Dallas police said that Oswald, 24, killed Mr. Kennedy and within an hour and a half killed Tippit when the

officer stopped him on a Dallas street.

Oswald was arrested minutes later. He was killed two days after the President's death.

The commission finished its hearings for the week and recessed until Monday.
