

Two Gun Experts Testify Before Warren Commission

WASHINGTON, March 31 (AP)—Two experts on guns spent about six hours today testifying before the Warren commission investigating the assassination of President Kennedy.

J. Lee Rankin, counsel for the commission, said the testimony was "very fascinating," but he did not go into details.

Chief Justice Earl Warren, chairman of the commission, spent a good part of the afternoon going over various matters with Mr. Rankin while the hearing continued in another room.

The witnesses were Robert A. Frazier, a firearms identification expert for the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and Ronald Simmons, a weapons evaluation expert from Fort Meade. The commission already has looked at the Italian-made rifle that the police say was used to kill Mr. Kennedy in Dallas last Nov. 22.
