

N.B.C. PREPARING STUDY OF OSWALD

Huntley to Narrate Report
on Accused Assassin

The National Broadcasting Company is preparing a television report on Lee H. Oswald, the accused assassin of President Kennedy. The one-hour program, with Chet Huntley as narrator, will be presented next season, possibly in the fall.

Irving J. Gitlin, executive producer of N.B.C.'s creative projects unit, said the program would present the results of a large-scale investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy, and Oswald's role in it. Mr. Gitlin said that research has been under way for two months.

A part of the report also will deal with Jack L. Ruby, who murdered Oswald two days after President Kennedy's death.

Mr. Gitlin said that if the Warren commission investigating the assassination issued its report before the N.B.C. study is completed, this report would be incorporated.

But N.B.C. will not delay its program until the commission reports. There has been no announcement by the commission, which is headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren, of when it will make its report.
