

## Kennedy Guard's Charge Is Studied

WASHINGTON, May 22 (UPI)—The commission investigating the Kennedy assassination has asked the Federal Bureau of Investigation to look into allegations by a suspended Secret Service agent of heavy drinking among the White House detail.

J. Lee Rankin, counsel to the commission, said today that the contents of the report would determine whether the seven-man group would hear Abraham Bolden.

Mr. Bolden, the first Negro to serve on the White House Secret Service detail, has been indicted on charges of trying to sell a Government report to a man charged in Chicago with taking part in a half-million dollar counterfeiting ring. He made the drinking charges at a news conference yesterday. A Government prosecutor has called the Bolden story "fantastic."

It is assumed that if the commission decides to examine the Bolden charges, it may also call others who might know about practices of Secret Service personnel.

It was understood that no decision had yet been made

on whether to take testimony from Jack L. Ruby, the former Dallas nightclub operator who has been sentenced to death for the fatal shooting of President Kennedy's alleged assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald.
