

COMMISSION TRACES ASSASSINATION SHOTS

DALLAS, May 27 (UPI) — A re-enactment of the assassination of President Kennedy has proved that the bullets could have been fired only from the Texas School Book Depository building. The Dallas Times Herald said today.

The newspaper said that it had been informed by reliable sources that the Warren Commission's sole purpose in the re-enactment, last Sunday, was to prove this.

The Times Herald said the re-enactment had been prompted by continuing reports that the bullets last Nov. 22 came from either the triple underpass near Elm and Houston Streets or from a grassy knoll.

Agents of the Secret Service and the Federal Bureau of Investigation went through every phase of the crime.

Two F.B.I. agents played the roles of the President and Gov. John B. Connally Jr. The Governor was wounded by the assassin's bullet. A special Secret Service car was flown from Washington for the study. Surveyors measured angles from the sixth-floor corner window of the building. Lee Harvey Oswald, slain two days after the assassination by Jack L. Ruby, was accused of firing the shots from the window.

Results of the re-enactment will be included in the Warren Commission's report.
