

Ruby Appeal Hearing Delayed

DALLAS, Tex., June 27 (AP) —An assistant district attorney says Jack Ruby's appeal of his conviction of murder will not be heard by the court of criminal appeals this year.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Jim Bowie said yesterday the delay would be caused by the length of time needed to prepare a trial record that may involve 5,000 pages.

Phil Burleson of the Ruby defense team yesterday asked

Judge Joe B. Brown to also have prepared a record of hearings held before Ruby's murder trial.

A jury in Brown's court assessed Ruby's punishment at death after convicting him of murder in the slaying of Lee Harvey Oswald, President John F. Kennedy's accused assassin.
