

Ruby Lawyers Get Delay on Appeal

DALLAS Tex., Sept. 26 (AP) — District Judge Joe B. Brown yesterday granted attorneys for Jack Ruby a 30-day delay in presenting the full record of his case in court for the appeal of his death penalty in the Lee Harvey Oswald slaying.

Oswald was the accused assassin of President John F. Kennedy.

The grant of extra life was made after Phil Burleson, one of Ruby's lawyers, filed a motion requesting the extension to present the statements

of facts in the case.

Still Transcribing Records

The petition contended that more time was needed because court reporters have not finished transcribing the voluminous records of Ruby's trial.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Jim Bowie said the state would challenge the request for another delay by the defense in appealing the case.
