

20 Volumes of Testimony To Be Made Public Later

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27 (AP) — About 20 volumes of testimony before the Warren Commission are still to be made public.

The testimony was taken at commission hearings into President Kennedy's assassination. The volumes, which also include pictures of exhibits gathered by the commission, were to have been released at the same time the 296,000-word report was made public.

But the White House decided to concentrate first on the printing and distribution of 50,000 copies of the bulky report. The rest will be released as soon as possible, officials said, but they gave no indication when that would be.
