ON OSWALD REPORTED DALLAS, OC. 7 (UPI) Dallas police chief said Tuesday that an agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had asked him to deny that the F.B.I. had failed to warn the police about Lee Harvey Oswald. The Warren Commission report on President Kennedy's assassination criticized the F.B.I. for such a failure. In a letter to the Warren Commission made public yester-day, Police Chief Jesse Curry said the request came from Gordon Shanklin, agent in charge of the Dallas F.B.I. of-fice on Nov. 22, the day of the assassination. assassination.

assassination. <u>Chief Curry told newsmen</u> that day that although the F.B.I. had known about Oswald, they had passed on no informa-tion to the Dallas police. "With-in a few minutes of my state-ment to the press," Mr. Curry said in the letter, Mr. Shanklin was on the phone. <u>The F.B.I. later acknowledged</u> that it had had Oswald under-investigation.
