## IN WARREN DATA Article Terms Inquiry Into Tippit Slaying Inadequate

A Columbia University research team has charged that the Warren Commission failed to interview all persons able to agive information about events connected with the assassination of President Kennedy in Tallas last Nov. 22.

Mashes said they also had found related incidents on the personnel and facilities at the Teast School Book Depository, from laying the shots that killed the President were fired.

Their findings, based on an independent two-week study in Dallas that included interviews with some of the witnesses, are miblished in today's issue of The New Leader, a hiweekly magazine sponsored by the American Labor Conference on International Affairs, Inc.

Unquestioned Witnesses

The magazine article, called the Other Witnesses." says that the Warren Commission failed to question all those who saw the slaying of Patrolman J. D. Tippit, the Dallas police officer who was said to have stopped and questioned the Pressident's assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald.

The Nashes asserted they were able to locate two persons who were not questioned. They were Mr. and Mrs. Frank Wright, who have in a highest from the attention the attention of the participants.

The authors descrining Mr.
Wright's report on what he saw when the patrolman was killed, conclude with a quote from him:

""I knew a man drove off in gray car. Nothing in the world's going to change my opinion, I saw a man drive off in a gray coupe just as clear as I was born. They can say all they want about a fellow running away, but I can't accept this because I saw a fellow get in a car and drive away."

Noting that Mr. Wright's story differed, sharply from the Warren Commission Report, the

## Ambulance Driver Mentioned

The Nashes also point out that Mrs. Wright called for an ambulance and that the police records show it was her call first led to a response from the Dudley M. Hughes Funeral Home. The ambulance driver, Clayton Butler, also was not questioned by the commission, according to the authors. In Turning to the Warren Report, the Nashes noted that the commission had relied on testimony from Mrs. Helen Louise Markham on the Tippit slaying, and they described this information as "in direct contradiction" with that garnered from the people they interviewed.

Other Omissions Alleged

The Nashes also said the commission's report had "unresolved his untouched" these points: "Information on a second witness to the Tippit slaying interviewed by the rederal Bureau of Investigation. Declaring that their aim was not to establish "any person's guilt or innocence," the Nashes said they had undertaken the study "to demonstrate that future historians and social scientials will not he able to reconstruct what occurred from the commission's report alone."

As the years pass they conchided, "questions will become increasingly difficult to ansswer with any degree of accuracy." 6274 16276 173
