

# JOHNSON TO FORGE PARADE IN DALLAS

Will Be Flown by Copter

to Rally and Dinner

DALLAS, Oct. 13—There will be no Presidential motorcade Monday when President Johnson comes here for two campaign speeches.

The President will be flown from the airport to a downtown public rally and then to a fund-raising dinner by helicopter.

It will be his first visit to Dallas since he rode in the motorcade in which President Kennedy was assassinated last Nov. 22.

Officials of the Secret Service and the Federal Bureau of Investigation from Washington and Dallas met here tonight, spokesmen said, with Dallas law enforcement authorities to set up elaborate security precautions.

Both Federal agencies were sharply criticized in the report of the Warren Commission on the assassination for inadequate liaison and precautions in connection with the Kennedy visit.

The Dallas Times-Herald quoted "unimpeachable sources" in a copyrighted article today as saying James P. Hosty Jr., Dallas agent, was suspended without pay for 30 days Oct. 5, shortly after the Warren report was made, and transferred to Kansas City.

## Placed on Probation

Earlier Mr. Hosty had been placed on probation for 90 days and given a letter of censure, The Times-Herald said.

It said three other F.B.I. agents in Dallas received letters of censure last week.

Last spring Mr. Hosty's supervisor, Kenneth Howe, was demoted and given a cut in salary. He was shifted from security desk here to routine investigating work. He is now reported to be on leave and may face further disciplinary action.

Mr. Hosty had investigated Lee Harvey Oswald, who had once defected to the Soviet Union, before President Kennedy's arrival. The Secret Service, which has primary responsibility for Presidential protection, was not notified that Oswald worked at the Texas School Book Depository building on the President's motorcade route. When the motorcade passed the building, Oswald shot and killed Mr. Kennedy from a sixth-story window.

## 'Maintaining Liaison'

J. Gordon Shanklin, special agent in charge of the Dallas F.B.I. office, said today his office was "maintaining liaison with the Secret Service" and would "furnish assistance as necessary" for President Johnson's visit.

City Manager Elgin Craft said city authorities and police department were "cooperating" with the Secret Service "in every way." But that was all they were doing, and the Secret Service was doing even less.

The tight-lipped attitude from all quarters was in sharp contrast with that of 11 months ago, when so much information about the coming Kennedy visit was available that...
