

Spare Ruby's Life, Oswald Wife Urged

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Marina Oswald wrote a letter to the attorney prosecuting Jack Ruby, asking that her husband's killer be spared the death penalty.

Mrs. Oswald's action was disclosed by the Warren Commission.

"It is simply that it is pity to—I feel sorry for another human life," she told the commission last February, "because this will not return—bring back to life Kennedy or the others who were killed."

Mrs. Oswald said at the time that she had not mailed the letter. It was not known Tuesday whether she ever did. Ruby's death sentence for killing Lee Harvey Oswald is under appeal. *ev*
