

# Assassination Report Attacked by Attorney

Mark Lane, New York attorney who contends President John F. Kennedy's assassination was the work of more than one man, charged here Wednesday the Warren Commission report is a "gigantic fraud."

"The person or persons who killed officer J. D. Tippit are still at large and the assassins of President Kennedy are still walking the streets. And the government knows this," he said.

But Lane refused to speculate on the motives of the commission which investigated the late President's death a year ago last Nov. 22.

He would only say that the commission—headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren—deliberately misled the world about the events surrounding Mr. Kennedy's death. He told a press conference at the Biltmore the voluminous report "is a gigantic fraud that has been perpetrated on the American public."

"There is no proof at all in any of the testimony taken that Oswald was involved in the assassination or the murder of Tippit," he said.

Lane charged that numerous eye-witnesses to the assassination were not called to give testimony that would have proved the shots that killed the President did not come from the Texas School Book Depository building, but rather were fired "by more than one person" from behind bushes on a grassy knoll in front of the Presidential motorcade in Dallas. Lane, who said he is chairman of the Citizens' Committee of Inquiry formed to investigate the assassination, is in Los Angeles to speak on the Warren report Friday night at Beverly Hills High School. The talk is sponsored by Discussions Unlimited, Inc. He will be cross-examined on his views by Joseph A. Ball, a counsel for the commission; Herman F. Selvin, former president of the Los Angeles County Bar Assn., and A. L. Wirin, chief counsel of the Southern California chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union.
