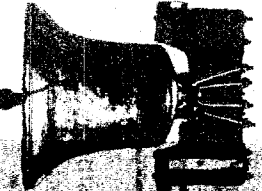

The Warren Commission Report on the assassination of President Kennedy and the events surrounding the assassination has recently been made public. While the conclusions of the Report have generally been widely accepted, according to the mass media, a significant number of newspapermen, writers, and others have raised persistent doubts about the validity of the conclusions reached in the Report.

Doubts and reservations have been expressed by Mr. Murray Kempton, N.Y. World-Telegram 9/29/64; Miss Dorothy Kilgallen, N.Y. Journal-American, 9/30/64; Mr. Robert C. Ruark, N.Y. World-Telegram, 10/9/64. Books by Mr. Joachim Joesten and Mr. Thomas Buchanan, and articles by Mr. Richard Dudman, St. Louis Post-Dispatch; Mr. Gene Roberts, Detroit Free Press; Messrs. Jack Minnis and Staughton Lynd in New Republic and others were published prior to the Report but attacked one or more of the conclusions in the Report.

Discussion Unlimited believes that the doubts, disputes and disagreements about the Report should receive a thorough airing. To that end Discussion Unlimited sponsors this forum. Mr. Lane will present his disagreements with the Report and the panel of three prominent attorneys will subject Mr. Lane's theories to the challenge and scrutiny of expert cross-examination.

MR. MARK LANE has been a civil rights and criminal attorney for 13 years. He was elected to the New York State Assembly from the Yorkville District of Manhattan and served from 1960-1962. He was the first legislator in the United States to be arrested as a Freedom Rider.

Shortly after the assassination of President Kennedy he was appointed counsel for Lee Harvey Oswald by Oswald's mother. He was not allowed by the President's Commission to function as a defense attorney but did testify before the Commission on two occasions.

Mr. Lane contends that the Warren Commission Report answers few questions, resolves no doubts, and when read by a reasonable person raises additional doubts. He has stated, "The Report of the President's Commission... despite its possible tranquilizing effect upon America... will rank in history with the finding that Dreyfus was guilty of treason."

Mr. Lane has conducted an extensive independent investigation into the facts surrounding the tragic events of November 22 and 24, 1963, and claims to have uncovered much evidence in support of his position.

These three well-known attorneys will cross-examine
Mr. Lane following his presentation:

MR. JOSEPH A. BALL practices law in Long Beach, California. He specializes in litigation both civil and criminal. He is a State Delegate from California in the House of Delegates of the American Bar Association. He is a member of the California Law Revision Commission, and a Regent of the American College of Trial Lawyers. He now serves as a Professor of Criminal Law and Procedure at the University of Southern California Law School, where he received his legal education. He is a past president of the State Bar of California and the Long Beach Bar Association, and has also served as Chairman of the National Conference of Bar Presidents. He was one of the consultants to and senior trial counsel for the Presidential Commission to Investigate the Assassination of President Kennedy.

MR. HERMAN F. SELVIN practices law in Los Angeles, California. He received his legal education at the University of California. He is a fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers. He is a past president of the Los Angeles City Board of Police Commissioners; past president of the Los Angeles County Bar Association; member of the U.S. Attorney General's Committee to Study Anti-Trust Laws 1953-55; member of the California Law Revision Committee since 1959 and its Chairman since 1961.

MR. A. L. WIRIN is a noted constitutional and civil rights attorney. He is chief counsel for the American Civil Liberties Union in Los Angeles and has represented persons advocating all phases of the political spectrum from left to right.
