

Ruby Court Plea Delayed Indefinitely

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) — The Texas Court of Criminal Appeals Wednesday granted an indefinite postponement of its March 10 hearing of Jack Ruby's appeal of his death sentence for slaying accused Presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

The high court said submission of Ruby's appeal and a decision on which attorneys will be recognized as his counsel should wait until the trial judge, Dallas Dist. Judge Joe Brown, decides whether Ruby is now sane or insane.

Ruby's sister asked the court not to recognize Texas lawyer Joe Tonahill as one of Ruby's attorneys. Another request to oust Tonahill, this time signed by Ruby, later was presented.
