'More Than 10' Chapters

Mr. Rousselot, who is 38 years old, appeared boyish with pale blue eyes and neat brown hair as he was interviewed in the new regional headquarters here of the society at 180 East Pond Road. The office is headed by Thomas J. Davis of Stamford, Conn. The region covers Maine to Florida and as far west as Pennsylvania.

Asked how many chapters the society had in Westchester, Mr. Rousselot said "more than 10." Mr. Davis interrupted to say "considerably more," adding that each had about 20 memadding bers. The groups generally meet
