They Will Get Me: It seems that JFK could be surprisingly formal, at times. Ex-Presidential secretary EVELYN Lincoln tells of sitting at her desk when the boss walked by with British Prime
Minister Harold Macmillan. Soon
Kennedy came back to Mrs. Lincoln's desk to look at the mail. "While he was going through it, he said, almost in a whisper and without raising his head, I think it would be nice if you would stand when a dignitary walks through your office." In the second installment of her memoirs in The Saturday Evening Post, Mrs. Lincoln also recalls how JFK used to tease his son: Hello there, Sam, how are you?" "I am not Sam, I'm John. Daddy, I'm John." Evelyn's husband, Harold (Abe) Lincolin, fretted in advance about JFK's fatal trip to Texas. "I even mentioned "Abe's fear to the President," Mrs. Lin-Coln writes. "He didn't seem alarmed; The merely said, 'If they are going to get me, they will get me, even in church'."
