

Hunt's Novel Approach

H.L. Hunt, the Texas supermillionaire, is taking a hand in South Vietnam's politics. Last month Hunt met privately with the South Vietnamese ambassador to the U.S. And when Saigon's new constituent assembly meets next year to write a constitution, delegates will have in hand freshly translated copies of a model constitution for "people of emerging nations," taken from Hunt's novel "Alpaca." It contains oilman Hunt's own superconservative ideas on how to run a country. (Sample proviso: extra votes for richer, better-educated citizens.) Hunt claims that in previous "anti-leftist" campaigns he helped save the Dominican Republic from Juan Bosch, Guyana from Cheddi Jagan and Indonesia from Sukarno.
