

A New Look at the Assassination?

Will the Kennedy assassination case be re-opened? Critics of the Warren commission report have been pressuring Washington to take another look at the evidence. (Just last week, *The Sunday Times* of London joined the clamor with a ten-page article about what it called the commission's "vulnerable document.") But an impressive array is against any further probe: the Kennedy family, President Johnson and Chief Justice Earl Warren privately oppose a new investigation as pointless. One major private foundation, however, has indicated it might back a thorough two- or three-year study of the case if a lawyer "with the right qualifications" came forward with such a proposal.
