# JFK Arranged

By WALDO PHILLIPS

On the evidence revealed through the press, and by insight and logical deduction, I maintain that President John F. Kennedy was not assassinated. He was shot at his own request.

He chose the killer. He and others were quite aware of his coming death, and they knew the exact spot and moment of the impact.

Let me present the reasons that I maintain that he committed an act of indirect suicide.

The plan was conceived when he announced two years before his death that he injured his back laying a cornerstone.

Any person with experience in using a spade is well aware that one injures his shoulders and not his back when spading. We know that he had had four operations on his back, plus a triple spinal fusion and a bone graft.

Medical reports had indicated that he had less than 90 days to live due to an intensified terminal malignant spinal cancer.

He was the worst President in history, being kept illumined by his press, and the only way he could be remembered would be through some drastic sympathy drawing act: an assassination.

The final act would fit perfectly with the image the press had created of him, and the silly reactions the Negroes would display.

The basic tangible facts which are present to show that he willingly rode gallantly to meet the bullet are these:

1. Adlai Stevenson was the recipient of hostile attacks less than 30 days previously in Dallas.
2. Texas' Gov. John Connal-

ly had requested the President to postpone his trip, for his life was in jeopardy.

3. The Dallas Morning News carried full-page advertisements attacking the President and warning him.

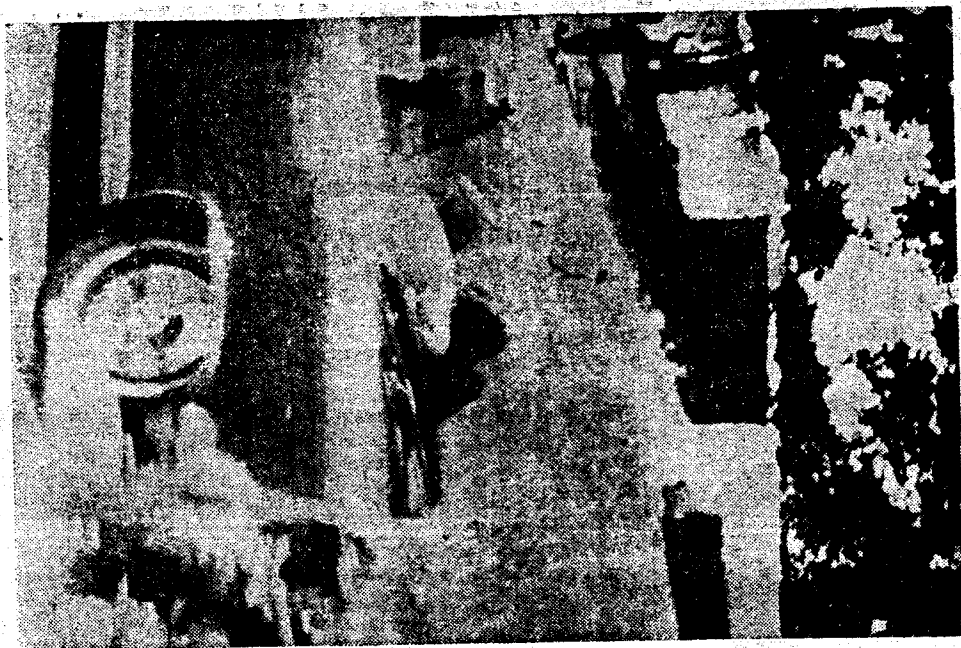
4. Dallas had been the seat of all anti-Kennedy demonstrators since 1960.

He should have grabbed the spot of the bullet's impact and not the exit spot. Oswald was located behind him.

Why did officials violate all health and safety codes in getting the body out of Texas while it was not embalmed?

Why wasn't an autopsy performed? One was done on Oswald.

Why was Kennedy's wife on this trip, when she had not made a trip with him in the U.S. since 1960?

Why did he request the removal of the bullet-proof top from his automobile in such hostile territory?

In Orange County, Cal., the Pacific Telephone Co. had heard Kennedy would be killed in Dallas. This information was heard 30 minutes prior to the shooting, enough time to stop the tour. Who was talking, and why wasn't the motorcade canceled?

Why was Vice-President Johnson on this trip? He could not in any way help to renounce the Democratic Party in Texas (the supposed reason for JFK's trip) because he had lost all Texas appeal

since the election.

## Martyr's Death

Last and most important: Why did Kennedy change his route of tour in Dallas at the last moment so that the motorcade would go past the School Book Depository?

Add these questions together and you may arrive at the same conclusions I have—that a vast stage was set for the "martyred" death of the "young warrior," his beautiful wife at his side and his next-in-command waiting valiantly in the wings to step into the breach. Now, let's look at the puzzle of Lee Harvey Oswald's role.

1. Two persons were seen in the window of the Texas School Book Depository by some witnesses. Who was and where is the second person? No one mentioned the smell of gunpowder in any room, and yet gunpowder lingers many minutes after a

shot is fired.

2. A .28-caliber bolt action rifle was used. How could one person load and then shoot a moving target dead center three times? Why did the police and the FBI give an incorrect description of the rifle in their first report? The gun was sawed off, crooked, and was over 20 years old.

3. No fingerprints were found on the rifle. Oswald also used a pistol when he shot Patrolman Tippett, so any test revealing gunpowder on his person is not valid.

4. The press painted Oswald as a psychotic. If he were, the normal expected behavior would have been for him to brag of the shooting.

Oswald maintained to his death that he did not do the shooting, and he did not withdraw into any abnormal state.

5. In a matter of seconds, Oswald descended several

flights of stairs or used an elevator, and was eating or drinking when the police entered the building.

Did police ask other employees how long Oswald had been there? This in itself would have cleared him.

Why didn't they do this most elementary piece of police work?

6. How could Oswald go to his rooming house, change clothes, travel three miles in

a congested city, and walk leisurely down a street? Since he made it home—a perfect escape—why did he walk back downtown?

7. What advantages could Oswald gain by shooting the President or the Governor? The President didn't issue any new hostile ideas, and Oswald's "hatred" of America was developed prior to Kennedy's election. Gov. Connally could not
