**Warren commission delays
report on assassination**

THE WARREN COMMISSION report on the assassination of President Kennedy may not be ready until Sept. 1—three months behind schedule—according to press reports. "Big gaps" in the evidence are said to be the cause, though the commission has not revised its July 1 deadline.

The commission heard testimony June 11 from Mrs. Marina Oswald, widow of the man accused of murdering Kennedy in Dallas Nov. 22. In her second appearance, Mrs. Oswald was questioned closely about her previous allegation that Oswald had planned to assassinate former Vice President Nixon.

Before her latest testimony, the New York Post stated that the widow would be asked to "explain discrepancies in her previous account of her husband's activities before the assassination." After she left, however, a commission spokesman said Mrs. Oswald "was questioned about a report that her late husband threatened to kill Nixon." The spokesman refused to elaborate.
