Following the Kennedy assassination, Mr. Lane formed the Citizens' Committee of Inquiry and began an investigation into the facts surrounding the assassination and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. He personally traveled to Dallas seven times, testified twice before the Warren Commission, and has lectured widely on his findings throughout the United States and Europe.
