RUSH TO JUDGMENT. Mark Lane. Holt, \$5.95

Mark Lane, lawyer for Mrs. Marguerite Oswald, rips into the Warren Commission report on the assassination of President Kennedy. Among other things, he traces the possible routes of the shots, he comes near to charging collusion between Jack Ruby and Dallas police, on the day when Lee Harvey Oswald was shot, and he charges that others besides Oswald were involved in planning the assassination. The book consists of

detailed arguments of Lane's main points, using reports some of which came before the Commission and some which didn't, for Lane has interviewed some people whom the Commission never reached. Lane's book has in common with Edward Jay Epstein's "Inquest" (Viking) the citing

of Commission conclusions which were not fully supported by evidence. The Epstein book is less diffuse and more readable: the Lane book has more fresh evidence. A film of "Rush to Judgment," made on location in Dallas, will be premiered in mid-September.
