Of all the critiques of the Warren commission report on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, few have been as impressively documented as one published this week by lawyer-author Mark Lane, who cast himself in the role of devil's advocate from the outset. Lane's new book, "Rush to Judgment," seems at first to shake almost every major conclusion of the Warren commission. But a full examination of Lane's critique also suggests that he himself has worked the same tricks of perspective that he imputes to the commission, and Newsweek's interviews with commission experts bear this out. Associate Editor Kenneth Auchincloss wrote the analysis of the latest dissent from a judgment that will still resonate for 100 years from now.
