

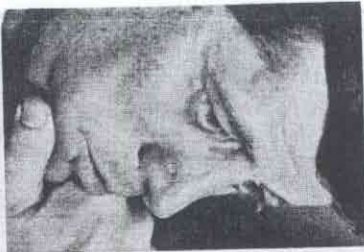

It is an electrifying, heartbreaking and unforgettable account drawn from 1,000 interviews, revealing episodes and emotions never before made public—not on television, or on radio, not in any newspaper, magazine, book, or report. Mrs. Kennedy talked to the author for ten hours—about things she never discussed before or since. President Eisenhower has expressed the wish to Mr. Manchester that such a personal, detailed investigation had been made following the assassination of Abraham Lincoln.
