Attorneys Hold Secret Talks on Kennedy Book

Session Aimed at Clearing Way for April Publishing of Controversial Manuscript

NEW YORK (A)-Secret meetings were held Thursday to clear the controversial book "The Death of a President" for publication by Harper & Row in April. Lawyers were granted four additional days to work out an agreement.

The meetings follow a compromise Wednesday night between representatives of Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy and Cowles Communications, Inc., allow-ing the 80,000-word, fourpart series to begin in the Jan. 10 issue of Look magazine.

Look agreed to make some changes and deletions in the book by William Manchester that con-cern the private life of Mrs. Kennedy and her two children. Sections of the book reportedly unfavorable to President Johnson will remain. The book deals with events surrounding the assassination

of President Kennedy.

It was learned Thursday, meanwhile, that Mrs. Kennedy and her children, Caroline and John Jr., are booked on a flight to Antigua, British West Indies, on Monday, This is the day before a scheduled hearing in her damage suit against Cowles, Harper & Row and Manches-
