Jones is not saying that Ruby, tricken with an advanced stage of neer at Dallas-Parkland hostal, is the victim of a plot to kill m. Jones does raise questions, the wever, about how Ruby's disease chuld have remained undetected

Ruby was transferred on De-mber 9 to Parkland, where Presdent Kennedy was taken after his sent Kennedy was taken after his seassination. He had been in the Dallas County jail since his conviction in March, 1964, for the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, accused assassin of the President; the conviction was later overturned, on a technicality, and Ruby will awaits his new trial.

During the time he was in the refail, Ruby was given periodic physical examination by county medical officials. For three weeks before he was rushed to the hospital, on the order of Sheriff J. E. (Bill) Decker, Ruby was suffering from what doctors diagnosed as a "bad

cold." Doctors at the hospital initially believed he had phedimonia. The doctors said Ruby was in relatively good spirits, despite the fact that he has been allowed to read newspaper accounts of his imminent death. Last Thursday, after diagnostic examinations had been completed, drugs were administered to keep the malignant cells from dividing and to retard the spread of the

gells. Ruby's sister, Mrs. Eva Grant artived at the hospital shortly after Ruby did, demanding to see him aid. "I don't care about die brocess of the law, that guy?" dying.

She said that on a recent visit to her brother at the jail, "he looked terrible, like a corpse.
