**Oxford Play
 About Oswald**

OXFORD, England (AP)—
 The Oxford Playhouse Com-
 pany has commissioned a
 documentary play "The
 Trial of Lee Oswald" for
 presentation early next
 year.

The author is Mark Lane,
 American lawyer who is due
 in England next month for
 the publication of his book
 attacking the Warren Re-
 port. He is expected to bring
 the play script with him.

The theater's director of
 productions, Frank Hauser,
 met Lane while visiting
 America this year and sug-
 gested he write the play.

It will be in two parts.
 The first will make the
 strongest possible prosecu-
 tion case against Oswald.
 This will be taken entirely
 from the report. It will in-
 clude tape recordings and
 film clips provided by Lane.
 The second part will show
 what Lane believes to be
 confusions and contradic-
 tions which a defense attor-
 ney might have brought out
 if Oswald had come to trial.
 Oswald himself will not
 be portrayed, Hauser said.

"Lane is not out to prove
 who did the murder,"
 Hauser said, "but to show
 that on the report's evidence
 the defense would have
 stood a very good chance of
 getting Oswald acquitted."

"The play will probably
 give no verdict."

Oxford Playhouse is
 owned by Oxford University
 but Hauser's resident com-
 pany is independently op-
 erated.
